



Medical Report

Unfortunately, like many other regional towns, we have still not been able to secure another GP yet, but we are actively looking, and endeavour to be able to take on new patients eventually given the growth in this town of late.

Bushcare Report

Given the grimness of the times, I do try to keep these columns upbeat, but unfortunately this month I do have to be downbeat due to recent environmental vandalism in our area.

Over 20 saplings and small trees have been poisoned along the foreshore and dune area at the end of Mitchell Rd. There are a variety of species involved, but most are Banksia integrifolia, the beautiful trees that are the reason why in the local indigenous language 'Callala' means, 'place of the banksias'.



Apparently when a post about this vandalism was made on Facebook, one reply was 'they're only trees'. That person obviously snoozed through their high school botany lessons on the importance of trees for the continuation of animal/human life on the planet. I think the rest of us know that quite apart from other benefits, trees sequester carbon and give off the oxygen we need to breathe.

On our beach, in basic ecological terms, trees with their extensive root system are a crucial part of slowing the loss of the dune area to erosion. If you walk along the beach from the Mitchell Rd access track to Wowly Creek you can see tree roots exposed all along the edge of the vegetation line. These trees will eventually fall including the largest of them, an Angophora costa. But that is 'natural' erosion or as natural as these things can be as our planet's climate changes quite dramatically.

Bushcare

There has been further vandalism on Callala headland, near Marine Parade and Bay St intersection. At this site, more than 25 trees appear to have been cut down. In the photo below you can see the stumps of two Casuarinas that have been cut down towards the top of the picture. Cut down branches of Banksia integrifolia are in the foreground.



Both these sites now have new signs erected by Council offering \$5,000 for information about the vandalism. In time Council workers will replace the trees, but that's our rates paying to replace trees that grew naturally. Garden Club

As I write this, NSW is in lockdown for a week which means that our August 21st meeting won't go ahead. We must work through it again and gardening is going to be my saviour. Spring is just round the corner, days are getting warmer, and there are changes in plant growth.

My Sweet Peas are in flower, the Cornflowers are budding, and my mum's Magnolia tree is in full bloom. However, nothing signals Spring like the green leaves and gold blooms of the magnificent wattle. Wattles belong to the genus Acacia and there are over 1000 Australian species. We have adopted the wattle as our country's floral symbol and only a few weeks ago during the Olympic games in Tokyo, our athletes stood proudly in their yellow and green uniform.

When you walk around Callala, the most popular wattle is Acacia Longlifolia, the Golden Wattle. Wattles should be planted in full sun or part shade locations. They grow well in most soil types provided they have good drainage. There are some species that grow into trees, but most wattles are super-fast-growing shrubs. Wattles are a short-lived plant but they look so good when in bloom. They aren't fussy about soil types but do need it to be free draining, so don't plant in soggy spots that are slow to drain after heavy rainfall. Water young trees regularly while they're establishing. During hot days and drought conditions give them a drink to keep them going.

Community Church

Most of us would have filled out our census form just over a week ago. You know what they say? "There are lies, damn lies and statistics!" It is debated who originated the saying, though it appeared in Mark Twain's biography.

'Figures often beguile me, particularly when I have the arranging of them myself; in which case the remark attributed to Disraeli would often apply with justice and force: "There are three kinds of lies: lies, damned lies and statistics."' - Mark Twain's Own Autobiography: The Chapters from the North American Review. No doubt we need statistical data to make good decisions, the problem is, sometimes we get so

much data it confuses, or, we have conflicting data used by opposing points of view that actually get us nowhere.

There is little doubt that when the census data is compiled, we will find there will be a decline in those who tick the Christian faith box and an increase in those who mark no religion. But what does that mean?

Statistician Ryan Burge argues in his book "The Nones" (Meaning not religious) it is easy in the popular imagination to equate "no religion" with atheism. From sociologists Tim Clydesdale and Kathleen Garces-Foley interviews of Americans in their 20s, they found only 14 per cent did not believe in God at all. Perhaps surprisingly, 35 per cent reported praying on a daily or weekly basis. Perhaps the problem stems more from a move away from church as an institution than belief in a spiritual world.

Understanding what church means requires us to move away from a building location or a denomination, instead see church as the people who meet together.

Despite his drug addiction and an early death Jimmy Hendrix was one of the most celebrated musicians of the 20th century, he did however have an understanding of what the world needs, this comes from his quote; "When the power of love overcomes the love of power the world will know peace".

That is exactly what Jesus did; Paul writing to the church at Philippi writes:

"Your attitude should be the kind that was shown us by Jesus Christ, who, though he was God, did not demand and cling to his rights as God, but laid aside his mighty power and glory, taking the disguise of a slave and becoming like men. And he humbled himself even further, going so far as actually to die a criminal's death on a cross".

In anticipation, we are designing anti-cockatoo netting to protect our harvest.



CALLALA BAY PROGRESS HALL - A STORY OF COMMUNITY.

Part IIII

Following the extension of the Progress Hall in 1979, the big work was yet to come. In 1982, the Callala Bay tennis club, led by its foundation president Joy Trethewey, approached Council about building a tennis court on the land behind the hall/fire shed. John Hatton assisted again, and in 1984 funds were found from the Commonwealth Employment Program for further extensions and renovations to the hall. Total funding for the hall extension was \$53,318.

Of this, \$48,000 was from the Commonwealth Employment Program and \$5000 from the hall management committee. The tennis court also received funding and was built at a cost of \$26,000, of which \$5000 was cash from the tennis club; \$5000 Council cash donation; \$8000 Council loan and \$8000 a grant from Department of Sport and Recreation. The May-

or Harry Sawkins praised the Callala Bay community for their total fundraising effort raising \$10,000.

Things had come a long way from the goose raffle, and the whole community celebrated at the opening of the hall extension and the tennis court on 24 January 1985. John Hatton (MP) was in attendance, and the Mayor Harry Sawkins did the honours of the official opening. A street parade was held; there were clowns, a barbeque, raffles, games and competitions for the kids, and dancing went on into the small hours inside the hall with its wonderful wooden floors.

At last, the Callala Bay community had got its hall. It had taken 21 years.

In 1992 it truly became just 'the hall' – rather than hall/fire shed – when the fire truck left the shed and moved to the new fire station on Emmett Street, which was opened on 24 October 1992. The fire-shed area of the hall was converted to a meeting room.

CALLALA BAY PROGRESS HALL - A STORY OF COMMUNITY.

Part IIII

Callala Bay continued to grow. It no longer had just the Mitchell's general store, now there were shops on Emmett Street. A primary school was planned (it opened in 2000; previously, the children went to Culburra, or further back in time, to Pyree). More public space was needed, and in 1996 the new community hall on Emmett Street was officially opened, beside the planned school. That hall, with different facilities, helps to serve the multiple needs of Callala Bay's growing community.

The Callala Bay Progress Hall is an essential part of Callala Bay history. It was begun at a time when the most important thing for a small community was to build a place where people could get together. The very first thing the Progress Association wanted back in 1963 was not a sports ground, not even a fire truck, but a hall. It was built with years of local fundraising, hard work and effort.

It has seen playgroups, children's birthday parties, weddings, music nights, birthday parties, craft groups, yoga, folk dancing, worship groups, community fundraising activities; and continues to do that and more. Many of the groups still meeting there have been using the hall for years – like craft (a foundation group); folk dancing (started in 2004) and yoga (since 2008). Other relative newcomers include tai chi and Over '60s Fitness Classes.

Our Callala Bay Progress Hall is a wonderful space that deserves heritage listing, and is an amazing tribute to the resilience of the Callala Bay community that never gave up on its dream.



History Corner

The area surrounding Culburra was originally called Wheeler's Point after the first land holder George Wheeler. Land developer Henry Halloran renamed the area Culburra in the mid 1910's, which has an Aboriginal meaning of "sand".

The township of Culburra was designed by Henry Halloran himself, as landowner, designer, and surveyor.

The original lighthouse at Crookhaven Heads was constructed of timber in 1882 and located as part of the Shoalhaven Pilot Station with a Mr. Thomas Bishop being the first operator.

A new lighthouse to the south of the mouth of the Shoalhaven River was built in 1904 and the old wooden lighthouse was demolished.

The Jerrinja community now situated at Orient Point had a settlement at the base of Berry Mountain north of the Shoalhaven River and were then moved to Orient Point in the first Grant of Land to an Aboriginal community in Australia in the early 1900's. After World War II, when the freedom of movement given by the motor car and the introduction of 4 weeks holidays meant coastal villages, such as Culburra became popular venues for both holidays and retirement.
