SECRETARYS REPORT with thanks to Leann

The **Callala Bay Community Association's** last meeting for 2014 was jointly chaired by Joan Lewis and Howard Duncan (in the absence of the CBCA's President, Bill Hughes and Vice President, Bob Burbank).

Great to see 15 members and 3 visitors come out on such an awful rainy windy night. At the end of the night, 2 of our visitors joined our association, so welcome Jane and Mark.

The CBCA held its inaugural joint 'Sausage Sizzle' & 'Preloved Clothing and Book Stall' combining it with the Callala Christian Community Church, on the weekend that Callala had torrential rain and flooding.

Howard called it a 'dry run' to see how many sausage sangas we could sell – well, we almost got washed away!!! However we still managed to make a profit, but more importantly the committee who helped: - Howard, Jim, Joan, Julia, Leann, Pauline and Sandra, all had fun and most of us made a purchase, either from Howard at the BBQ or from the great selection of clothing and books that were on offer from the Church. Our left over food and drinks have been donated to the Callala Bay Rural Fire Brigade.

The CBCA has had nothing but great comments about how fantastic the Headland Pathway looks and how useful it is. We have now completed 600 metres, with about 1 kilometre to go – we are awaiting results of an Environmental Investigation, so we can proceed with Stage 2.

On the subject of the Chisholm Street DA (development application) from Council, the CBCA has put a letter into Council, asking that this money from the sale of these properties be put back into Callala Bay projects. It can take up to 2 years for them to decide whether or not to do this, so we will keep you informed.

SCC apply for annual grant under the NSW Safer Roads programme and we responded to their request to recommend projects which meet the necessary criteria. Our thanks go to Duncan Marshall for the research, preparing and forwarding our request that Chisholm St and Marine Parade not only meet the criteria but are long overdue for upgrading. Indeed we pointed out the Chisholm St has many defects, and in fact constitutes a road safety hazard for pedestrian and vehicle traffic. We still have a lot of projects 'in the pipeline' here at this association, so why not come to one of our meetings and have a say in how you would like Callala Bay to improve. Our meetings are held on the 2nd Wednesday of every month at the Callala Bay Progress Hall, 73-75 Boorawine Tce., Callala Bay commencing at 7.30 pm.

Our photocopier is now over 5 years old and we have printed over 800,000 pages. We have had it repaired several times in the last month, so we don't think it will do too many more issues of the Callala Bay News. The CBCA has applied for a grant of \$4k+ but the CBCA would need to contribute \$1k towards the new photocopier. This was agreed to at this meeting.

Each year we have donated \$500 each to the Callala Public School and Callala Business Chamber (for the Callala Carols), however due to the fact we may have to spend over \$5k on a replacement photocopier, the CBCA will therefore need to hold over this year's donations, until we are more financial.

January General Meeting, 14th January - 7.30 pm.

Annual General Meeting, 11th February - 7.30 pm.

February General Meeting, 11th February - commencing 5 minutes after the conclusion of the AGM.

General Meetings will then be held on the 2nd Wednesday of every month commencing at 7.30 pm.

A nomination for our AGM is printed in this issue, please remember you must be a financial member of the Callala Bay Community Association to nominate, second and take on a position on the committee.

A renewal for membership is also printed in this newsletter; you can also use this form if you would like to become a new member.

We held a discussion about our upcoming Australia Day event. Raffle tickets can be purchased at any of our general meetings, or you can donate a suitable new item to go in the hamper and we will give you a **FREE** ticket, putting you in the draw to win some great prizes.

'Wedding Reception House debate' - as the CBCA have only had positive comments from our members, we will leave this matter for Council to address.

Note: - If you see any criminal behaviour, please report it to Police, as statistics will help in future responses.

The CBCA will write to the Hon. Shelley Hancock, MP and request a 24 hour, 7 days a week, Police Station at Culburra Beach, or how we can help her to achieve this.

Our meeting closed at 8.15 pm and Joan wished all those in attendance a safe and happy Christmas and a prosperous New Year.

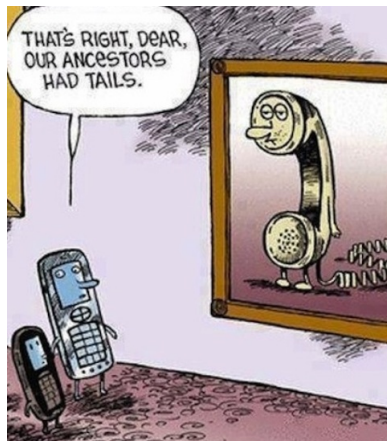

GONE FISHIN' with thanks to Jon Lee

Hi Fellow Fishos,

Not a lot on the fishing front to report on this month. Big seas and indifferent weather have impacted a lot. However when you can get out there, catching a kingie is easy, however catching a legal one is another story. Flathead have been good one day and off the next. Snapper have been hard to catch, both in the Bay and off Currarong.

Water temperature has been erratic, probably due to the recent heavy rain, and weather conditions. I think though with the increasing water temperature, once the conditions settle down we will be in for some good fishing.

To another subject. The Marine Parks. Approximately six months ago the current government allowed beach fisherpeople to fish in most of the Sanctuary areas in N.S.W. There were a few exceptions; the internal beaches of Jervis Bay were one of those. However we had one win 'Hammerhead Beach'. Yesterday this permission was revoked! After a comprehensive study of all the N.S.W. marine parks, the Government decided the 20 or so people using these areas every week have had such a devastating influence on the environment that they should be again closed off to the people again. At the same time they are still seriously considering allowing that huge development off Callala Beach and I have since heard that they are going to blow up part of the reef in front off Huskisson and dredge the entrance to Currumbene Creek, and then install a pontoon type dock for cruise ships. I personally do not have a problem with any of these developments. Of course I do not live on Callala Beach and have to look at them. Just wonder at the damage they are prepared to do in Jervis Bay Marine Park in the name of progress, yet they single out the Shoalhaven residents and tourists alone in the state and take away their right to fish off about 1 km off beach saying we leave too big a footprint in the park!

I have included a photo of my son with a couple of fish he caught this week in Weipa. It is closed season for Barramundi at present so he had to return it to the water but who cares; he still had a feed to take home.

The barra was about 86cms, the fingermark about 7kg.

Till next month, good health and good fishing.

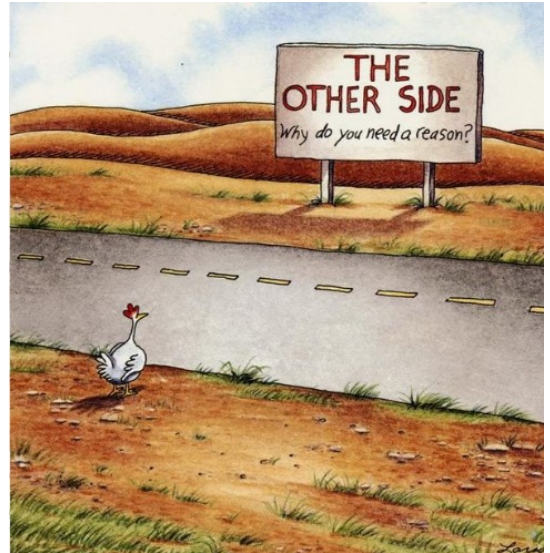

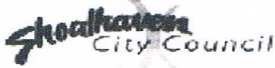

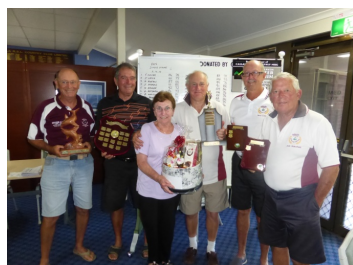
