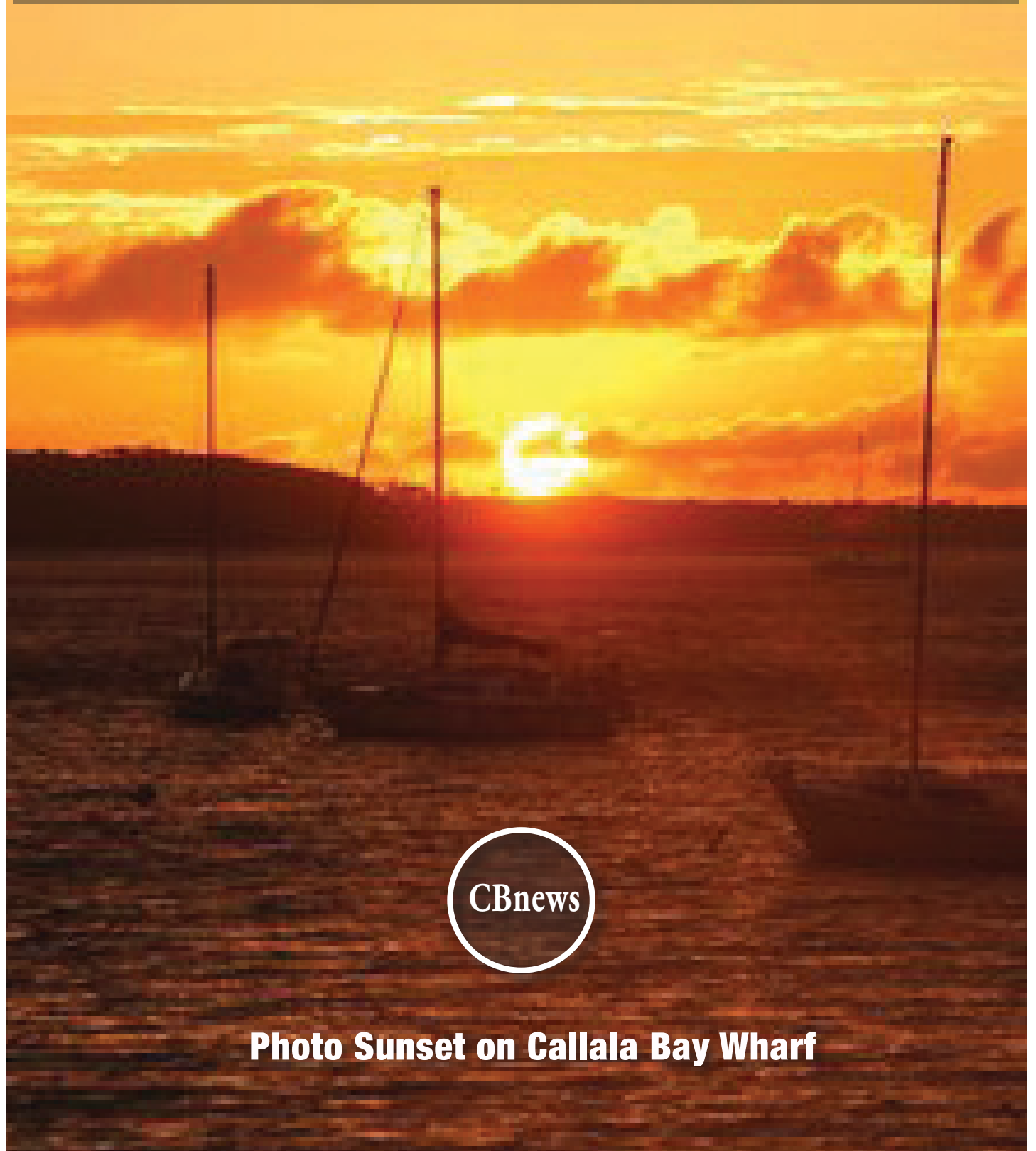

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# CBCA Report

July, 2020 meeting

Captain of the Callala Bay RFS, Sue Borrowdale addressed the gathering to propose a series of Community Engagement Meetings to discuss 'community fire readiness' for the 2020/2021 fire season, including how to properly prepare your property and develop a fire plan. Subject to Covid-19 restrictions, the proposed dates for the information sessions are Thu 3 Sep and Thu 17 Sep 2020. These sessions will be held at the Callala Community Centre from 7.00pm and the CBCA will assist in promoting the meetings on both the Callala Bay Community Association and Events Committee Facebook pages. Sue also spoke about issues relating to the most recent fire season. She advised the most significant issue from the last fire season was the community's ability to obtain accurate and timely information.

The Events Committee advised that due to the Covid-19 restrictions it is not possible to plan for future events at this stage. A project working group headed by Sue Chapman has been established, and the following projects have been suggested:

\*An outdoor gym. The group inspected a proposed site on the Callala Headland at Marine Parade. An initial letter has been sent to SCC seeking support and assistance with the project.

\*At the recent CBCA meeting it was recommended consideration should be given to include equipment for the less mobile or disabled users.

\* The concept of an addition to the skate park

for junior skaters to learn on, without having to use the more advanced ramps was also discussed briefly.

\*At the CBCA meeting held 8 Jul President Geoff Carne suggested consideration be given to the construction of an ocean rock pool and Narelle Monahan suggested construction of amphitheatre style seating in or on the foreshore which may assist in preventing further foreshore erosion. Other ideas for projects are welcome for consideration.

A special meeting of the project working group invited Sue Borrowdale to discuss measures which could be taken to reduce the risk of bush fire in Callala Bay. These included

\* fuel reduction of all perimeters and "island" parks within the urban area well before the season risk arrives and had the RFS written to SCC; and

\* It was suggested that a working party coordinated by the CBCA and in conjunction with the Callala Bay RFS clear the bush around Boorawine Creek to reduce the fuel load.

August is Being Medicine Aware Month with the National Prescription Services. Being medicine aware means:

- Knowing what and why you are taking medicine
- Understand the instructions
- Checking with your GP prior to starting new medications to consider side effects.
- Asking questions if there is something you don't understand about your medications.

It is easy to make mistakes about medication instructions, especially if there are several medications / dosage instructions, or as people are getting older. Unfortunately, those two risks run hand-in-hand. 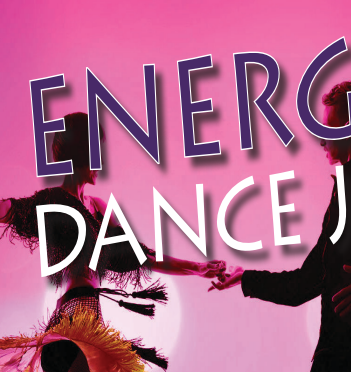

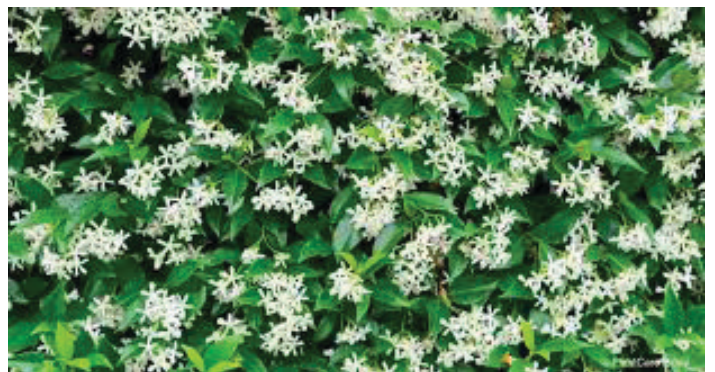
Those of you who love to walk and check out gardens in the neighbourhood, will have noticed an orange creeper in full bloom now. This is the Trumpet creeper



(*Pyrostegia venusta*) also known as the flame creeper. The trumpet creeper, native to South America, is an evergreen climber with vibrant, orange, tubular shaped flowers. It is in full bloom during winter to spring.

This creeper prefers full sun and because it is such a vigorous grower, it needs room to grow and a fence or support to climb over. If you want to conceal a large structure such as a carport, tank stand or an old fence this is the creeper for you. You need to water it regularly when first planted and during dry periods.

Some other vines /creepers to consider are the Hoya Mandevilla and Star Jasmine

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## Police Report

During this week, the weather is forecast to turn nasty with high winds, heavy rain, and low temperatures. The roads will become very wet and extremely slippery.

This is a timely reminder to drive to the conditions and really raise your awareness about what is going on in front of you and around you. There are a few locations in the Shoalhaven where water ends up over the road after heavy rain. Sometimes it might only be a trickle and at other times the water is deep and if you attempt to drive through it you could be washed away. Every year we read and hear of tragedies where people have been washed away and perished in floodwaters. Unfortunately, it continues to happen with disastrous consequences. The message is simple: if there are 'Road Closed' signed up, do not drive around them. If there is water across the road, do not drive through it. If you must turn around, take another route and drive for another 10 minutes, so what? It is much better than the alternative. Remember 'If it's flowing, don't keep going'.

Trees fall across roads in storms and these pose a few dangers. You might drive the same road for years; know the bends, bumps, and camber; regardless of the weather, you become used to the road, dive to the speed limit and become complacent. You know the road – or do you? What happens when you are driving in the rain, on the speed limit, go around a bend and find a tree has fallen across the road. The result? You have placed yourself in danger and maybe put other road users in similar danger. Please – drive to the conditions and slowdown in the wet.

## South Coast Vets

### Tips for Keeping Your Pet Safe.

1. Whenever you are out with your dog, keep it on a secure lead. This will prevent accidents, like the dog running on the road and getting hit by a car, attacks from other dogs, snake bites, escape and getting lost and fines from the ranger!

2. Keep your pets well confined, make sure your fences are safe and the gates are closed. Keep cats in enclosed runs if they are allowed outside.

3. Keep chocolate out of reach of pets. Dogs like the taste of chocolate and it is potentially very toxic.

4. Keep your medicines out of reach of pets, they may like the taste of these too and many human medications are very toxic to animals, especially in large doses.

5. Rubbish needs to be inaccessible, eating garbage can be like eating poison in some instances. Also cooked bones, meat skewers, meat wrapping, corn cobs and fruit stones in the garbage are very attractive to most pets and all potentially very dangerous if eaten.

6. Pesticides like snail bait and rat poisons need to be kept well away, they often taste great to pets and are potentially fatal when eaten.

7. Fertilisers are dangerous if eaten and often smell and taste good to pets.

8. Heat. Because pets don't sweat like humans, it is easier for them to get overheated on a hot day. Be aware and let your pet have access to cool places or air conditioning on a hot day.

9. Paralysis ticks thrive in the climate of Jeris Bay and their natural host is the bandicoot. You should have your pet dog and cat on tick preventatives all year round.

10. 1080 fox bait poisons are sometimes used in the Forest and National Parks in our area, be aware and do not let your dog in these areas, these poisons are rapidly fatal if eaten.

11. There are some hazards on the beach that dogs may be attracted to, like fish hooks, puffer fish and sea hares. Keep your dog on a lead and be aware of what is around.

12. Parvovirus is a potentially fatal gastrointestinal virus which affects dogs. It is a virus that survives well in the soil and can be activated by factors including recent rainfall and long and dry periods. Vaccinations are very effective and the only way to prevent this disease.

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## Eye Health

Glaucoma: "The silent thief of sight" by Anna Richter EyeQ Optometrists Vincentia

Glaucoma is an eye disease in which there is progressive damage of the optic nerve. Most commonly the eye pressure is elevated, damaging the optic nerve, however Glaucoma can develop in people with normal or low eye pressures.

Aqueous fluid is constantly pumped into and drained from the eye. A normal eye pressure is maintained when there is a balance between the production and drainage of this fluid. If there is too much fluid being produced, or not enough fluid draining due to a blockage, the eye pressure can increase, increasing the risk of glaucoma development. An increase in eye pressure can cause damage to the sensitive optic nerve cells at the back of the eye, this is what happens in glaucoma. Optic nerve cells carry messages from your eye to your brain and once damaged, vision is lost permanently.

Sadly, there are few symptoms for early glaucoma. Glaucoma rarely causes pain or discomfort. Glaucoma progresses slowly and initially affects your peripheral vision without you being aware. It has been estimated that you can lose 50% of the optic nerve cells before you have noticeable loss of vision. People with advanced vision loss from glaucoma will eventually develop "tunnel vision", where they can only see through a small central field of view.

Glaucoma can occur at any age, but most commonly it affects people over the age of 40 years. Someone with an immediate family member with glaucoma is at a greater risk of developing glaucoma, as well as someone with diabetes or other vascular disease (e.g. high blood pressure).

Accurate diagnosis of glaucoma is essential. This involves several sophisticated tests which include measuring the eye pressure and corneal thickness, testing the visual field, analysing the health and structure of the optic nerve with digital imaging and Ocular Coherence Tomography (OCT), and checking the aqueous fluid drainage is not blocked. The testing of glaucoma is not painful.

If diagnosed early, glaucoma can be treated with minimal loss of sight. In most cases, glaucoma is treated with prescription only eye drops, which reduce the eye pressure. If diagnosed with glaucoma, the treatment will be ongoing for life. Recently there have been new surgical techniques developed which in many cases offer a permanent control of eye pressure without the need for eye drops. One method uses a laser, called Selective Laser Trabeculectomy (SLT) and the other method is called MIGS (minimally invasive glaucoma surgery). Both are designed to improve aqueous drainage from the eye.

The main "take-home" message is that you need to have your eyes checked regularly. If you are under 40 years of age with no risk factors, every 3 years is adequate for a routine examination. If you are over 40 years of age or have any risk factors, you should have 1-2 yearly eye examinations, under the advice of your optometrist.

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## Recipe of the Month



### Sour Cream Apple Slice

*A soft vanilla bean cake topped with sour cream and studded with juicy apple. You'll have no trouble finding taste testers for this delightful cake.*

Ingredients;

#### Base

½ cup (75g) self-raising flour  
½ cup (75g) plain flour  
2/3 cup (150g) caster sugar  
2 tsp Natural Vanilla Extract  
1 egg  
100g butter, melted  
¼ cup (60ml) milk

#### Topping

200g sour cream  
400g tinned sliced apple  
1 tsp Vanilla Bean Paste  
2 eggs  
2-3 tsp Cinnamon, for sprinkling

Method;

Base

#### STEP 1

Preheat oven to 160C (fan forced). Line a 19cm x 29cm lamington tray with baking paper.

#### STEP 2

In a large bowl, combine flours, sugar, vanilla extract, egg, butter and milk. Stir to combine. Bake for 10 minutes. The cake won't be fully cooked at this stage.

Method - Topping

#### STEP 1

While cake is cooking, combine sour cream, apples, vanilla paste and eggs in a bowl and stir to combine. Spoon evenly over cake mixture and return to the oven for 20-25 minutes.

#### STEP 2

Sprinkle cinnamon over top of cooked cake and allow to cool before refrigerating for 2 hours until cold.

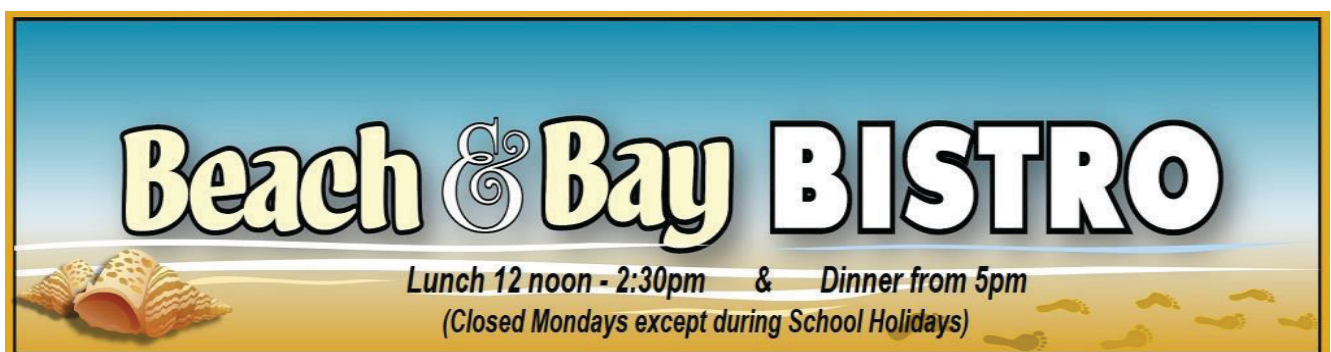

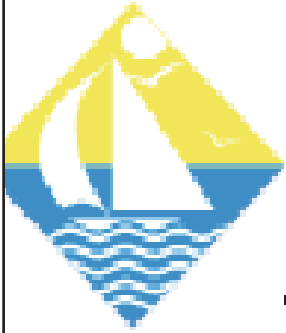
