



Presidents Report

Well, that was an amazing few months! Thankfully we are coming out the other side and will soon be able to do things together as a community.

The Callala Bay Community Association tried several times to hold meetings and the occasional event, but COVID beat us every time! BUT no more. I am glad to tell you all that the next General Meeting of the Callala Bay Community Association will be at the Community Hall on Wednesday 10th November at 7pm. Please be aware you will need to show you are double-vaxxed and will need to sign-in. There is also a limit of 30 people in the hall. You are invited to come and discuss matters of interest to you and our community.

The CBCA Committee met on October 18 to prepare an agenda for the meeting and to discuss future events. Some of the matters we considered:

Please mark your calendars as the Australia Day Breakfast by the Sea will start our 2022 program of events. We will be running a raffle in January leading up to Australia Day to raise some funds to enable us to continue to work for the community. So, if you see some of our committee members -they will be wearing a white and blue CBCA badge- with a raffle book in hand please buy a ticket or three. Some of our local businesses have already donated some prizes - many thanks to them. The list of prizes and the donors will be revealed in early January.

We had to postpone our planned car boot sale in October, but we intend to hold one in 2022 around Easter. You might start thinking about all that stuff in your garage that someone else might love. More on that later.

Just a heads up for the community. A triathlon is planned for December 18 this year at Callala Bay. As for past triathlons, Forest Road will be closed for a period on the day. The CBCA has written to Shoalhaven City Council to ensure that they synchronise the traffic management on Coonemia Road on the day of the triathlon to keep disruption to a minimum.

We encourage community members to take an interest in the SCC Coastal Management Plan discussions on the Council website. Please have your say and let them know what is important to you. One of the things the CBCA wants included are some permanent toilets near Wowly Creek due to the numbers of people using that part of the beach. You can find links on the 'Get Involved' pages on the SCC website.

Many of you have signed the petition regarding the Sheaffe Street path. Thank you. We submitted over 900 signatures a few months ago and we intend to keep collecting signatures to forward to Council, as we believe the path is essential safety infrastructure for our community. We have been informed that a budget allocation has been made for the design and planning of the path this financial year, although it is not clear which financial year construction costs will be allocated. We will keep you informed as this becomes clearer.

A number of people have asked if they can be updated on the Shoalhaven District Memorial Hospital Redevelopment as there has been considerable discussion in the community about what exactly is happening and when things will start to change. The CBCA Committee has approached the Hospital for someone to speak at a future CBCA General Meeting with a date to be determined. We will let you know as soon as we know.

In the meantime, stay safe. We look forward to seeing you at our meeting on November 10 at 7pm.

How the locals like it



Bushcare

A couple of updates from last month. The plastic guards around the newly planted trees on the Callala Bay foreshore have been replaced with more appropriate cardboard versions. And after I reported the observation of farmer Don who drew my attention to the small area of Coolatai grass near the Mitchell Rd beach access track, Council staff inspected the site. Don was right, and the noxious weed has been treated with a herbicide. This particular poison enters the plants via the root system, so our current rainy period is helpful. The herbicide will kill both the plants and seeds but it takes a couple of months. Effectively eliminating this weed is proving difficult in farming areas where it has spread densely before being recognised.

Speaking of problem weeds, there is an infestation of Ipomoea purpurea common name, Morning Glory, growing just off the footpath along Lackersteen Street, just past the pumping station. When I looked online to find this photo of its flower I came across another common name 'mile a minute' which gives an idea of how fast this invasive climber grows! It covers both undergrowth areas, shrubs and can wind its way over four metres up trees. Definitely a weed for our group to tackle now that Covid rules have been relaxed and we can condict our weekly sessions again.



Spring time is a delightful time to observe our native orchids. Australia has the most diverse array of orchids on the planet, with over 1,000 different species. We are fortunate to have many

on show in the bushland around Callala in spring time. The following two photos were taken here by Janelle Menzies, a talented local landscape photographer.

The first is a Caladenia carnea, commonly known as 'Pink Fingers' although their colour ranges from white, through pale pink to this crimson one. The flowers are tiny, maybe the size of half the top joint of your thumb.



Pterostylis or Green Hood orchids are somewhat larger, although as the ants climbing on this specimen demonstrate, they aren't giants!



One of my favourite local orchids is the Tiger Orchid. Like other Australian orchids, the individual plants don't flower every year. One morning recently I was walking in the bush near my home, and feeling a bit downcast. As I approached my back gate I saw a Tiger Orchid. Just one, and growing where I'd never seen one before. My mood lifted considerably!

Garden Club Report

Our first meeting will be a week later on Saturday October 23rd with new Covid guidelines. Members and visitors will have to be double vaccinated and show their certificate before entry to the church. It seems a lifetime since we last met which was in July. It will be lovely to catch up with everyone.

This week I visited a friend in Culburra, and while showing me her lovely garden, she pointed to a mass of blue objects nestled among her plants in a shady and protected area. It was the nesting area of a Bower bird. The Satin Bowerbird gets its name from its habit of building a bower out of sticks, and decorating it with blue items, like stolen pegs, straws, and bits of litter, as well as blue flowers and berries. The Satin Bowerbird is thought to go for blue objects because it reflects its colouring, which in turn attracts the right mate. My friend said that this year the Bower bird moved his collection of blue objects and nested in a different part in the garden. You can encourage Satin Bowerbirds to build their bowers in your garden by planting lots of local native shrubs, trees, and plants.



On a sad note, the Garden club has lost one of most our popular and loyal members, Isabel Angus. Isabel and husband Ian lived in Callala Bay until a few years ago when she moved away to be near her daughter. Isabel passed away on September 29th at the age of 93. They built their red cedar home and keeping with the natural beauty of the area decided on a bush garden. She joined the Society of Growing Australian plants

and learnt about growing natives. As a member of our garden club since 1991, Isabel shared this knowledge on numerous occasions as guest speaker. Their house sold earlier this year, but her garden endures. Isabel was a special lady and we feel privileged to have known her.

Culburra Beach & Districts Men's Shed

We're back!!!!

The Shed re-opened on 13 October for fully vaccinated members and visitors. Our operations continue to be governed by NSW Public Health Orders regarding QR code use, space limits, mask wearing, etc. All members were keen to get "back to business" and catch up with their fellow members after our enforced closure.

Our immediate priority is to start our project to supply Shoalhaven City Council with 20 bird nest boxes for installation in local parks and gardens, per our recent Bushfire Recovery Grant (BRG).

The objective of the BRG is to replace habitat lost in the 2019/2020 fires and increase the population of target bird species in local urban areas. Some discussions have taken place with Council staff already. The presence of feral pests like Indian Mynas and Starlings in some of the likely placement locations may require some modifications to our normal nest box design.

The target species will be Crimson Rosellas, who are pugnacious against their own kind, but quite timid when confronted by Indian Myna birds and Starlings.

Our native parrots, including rosellas, are a colourful addition to backyards, gardens and local parklands. But please spare a thought for some of our other local birds that depend on (rapidly dwindling numbers of) tree hollows for shelter and breeding.

Our nest box range includes boxes for Australian Owlet Nightjars, Tree Creepers, Grey Shrike Thrushes, Kookaburras and Pardalotes. All of these birds are endemic to this area, but perhaps seen less often. Prices start at just \$30.

We return to the Callala Markets on 13 November and look forward to seeing our supporters and customers again.
