Medical Report

As some people may have noticed, the team at Callala medical centre has been busy giving out Pfizer vaccines the last few weekends. We have ample supply for both Pfizer and AstraZeneca Covid vaccines, and we will be opening up further availability through the working week for Pfizer vaccines.

That recent storm - I'm quite sure it was a Category 2 cyclone - was really wild, wasn't it? Previously I noted the undermining of the root system of the large Angophora that dominates our shoreline. I think this big old fellow will be tumbling down sooner rather than later given the impact of the surging sea during that storm.



Bushcare Report

I'm pleased to report that Council Bush Care workers have carried out planting work as per Council guidelines at both the sites where environmental vandalism has occurred as noted in last month's column. The young plants have plastic guard covers around them, secured by bamboo stakes. There's been a couple of instances of the bamboo stakes being removed, I think children visiting the beach find them appealing play things. I am going to seek permission to replace the plastic with cardboard covers which Council also uses. Our team used these for a regeneration site near Callala Beach. Cardboard is preferable to plastic due to the issue of plastic contamination of beaches and the ocean.



In fact all the trees along that section of fore dune closest to the beach will fall relatively soon due to the erosion by the sea. A number of people have spoken to me, distressed by the sight of the erosion. Their understandable thoughts are, can't the foredune be protected by the addition of extra sand, or large rocks? Well, no. OK, it could be done, but in my opinion actions like this would be a waste of money.

Coastlines are by definition, dynamic. Coastlines are also sensitive to environmental change. We cut down trees and clear scrub so we can build our homes near the beaches. We want native grasses removed and lawn grasses laid so we can have picnic and play areas. We put in jetties and boat ramps. All of these actions result in changes to our beaches and foreshore. One thing we could do, which would slow the inevitable erosion of our foreshore, is re plant some of the more diverse indigenous grasses, shrubs, small and large trees that have been removed over time. The greater variety of plants, the richer the soil becomes.



How the locals like it



Bushcare

When the Buffalo Grass which has roots that go down 10cm was planted along our foreshore, it replaced the Coastal Spinifex which has roots that go down a metre. Cutting down the Coastal Tea Trees and many of the large trees has weakened the whole environmental structure including the composition of the soil. Better soil results in stronger plants, which means less erosion. To my mind, that would be a lot cheaper and more effective in the long term than building a wall.

I have a thank you to issue on behalf of our community. I was recently approached by Don, a retired farmer, who pointed to a tufting grass and inquired 'Is that Coolatai?' I have to admit, when I first noticed this grass popping up in Boorawine Creek Reserve, my Bush Care antenna twitched and I thought, 'you're multiplying like you're a weed.' I did some research but couldn't identify it as a weed known in the Shoalhaven, so I decided it was just a 'busy' native grass. Back to my conversation with Don, he explained that Coolatai is classed as a noxious weed – it will quickly come to dominate pastures and neither stock nor native animals find it palatable.

I followed up Don's query with Council staff. Like me, the Bush Care team didn't think that this grass was found in the Shoalhaven. But the bad news from the Biosecurity Officer is that an infestation has been identified in South Nowra. We have been able to confirm Don's identification of the grass, and Council staff will eradicate the areas of this grass in Boorawine. Without Don's query, another few seasons, and is invasive weed would have become a more entrenched problem, and definitely more expensive to get rid of. Apparently this grass was imported from South Africa in the nineteenth century as a potential pasture grass. The lesson that it wasn't palatable to our live stock wasn't learnt and more seedlings were imported in the 1950s and 60s. Let's hope, in 2021, lesson learned!

Garden Club

Due to the current lockdown we could not meet for our September meeting. Gardening at home and at the CCG and walking along the beach every morning has been the best way to get rid of any Covid blues. As I look at my cottage garden, I am constantly reminded of all the plants bought from the trading table and those given to me by garden friends. It is so colourful as all the bulbs are in flower -Freesias, Babianas, Cliveas and Bluebells.

Every month I receive an article called Readings from Garden Clubs of Australia Vice President, Mr John Kitt. His latest topic was on birdbaths. "Bird baths are a familiar sight in Australian gardens but surprisingly little is known about the precise role they play in the lives of birds. And so, the Bathing Birds Study was born. Started by researchers at Deakin University and Griffith University in 2014, this study involved collecting data online from 2,500 citizen scientists on bathing birds all over Australia. The study has revealed so far that bird baths are much more than just ornamental splash pools for feathered visitors. They're also a site where animals socialize, and intense rivalries play out. Human choices – such as the design of the bird bath, where it is located and how often it is cleaned – can have a big impact on birds."

Garden Club Report

Here's some tips as listed from article-

1.the most popular bird bath is the traditional pedestal or elevated bath type. These keep birds safe from cats who are a risk to them in the garden.

- 2. Baths should be situated near plants so smaller birds can have refuge if they are disturbed. Stones or rocks in the centre of the bath can give smaller birds a place to perch while bathing.
- 3. Other types of baths, such as pots or saucers on the ground, can provide water for a range of wildlife species so consider having multiple types of water baths in your garden.
- 4. Birds need to do their grooming in a bath not just in the summer months but in winter as well.
- 5. The garden bird bath needs regular cleaning. A dirty bath can spread disease and birds can be susceptible to infection.
- 6. Bath bullies -The study found that different bird species dominated bird baths depending on state or region. In New South Wales, aggressive noisy miners and rainbow lorikeets were most frequently recorded at baths. Certain birds can act as bullies at baths and prevent other birds from using it by standing guard.



We have a bird bath in the back yard and it's always a wonderful sight watching our bird life socializing and having a splash. Stay safe everyone and enjoy your garden.

Culburra Beach & Districts Men's Shed

We have been closed, in line with NSW Health Public Health Orders for regional locations, since 16 August, and missed the (cancelled) Callala Markets in September. Present indications are that we will likely miss the October markets as well.

On a brighter note, we were pleased to recently be approved for a Bushfire Recovery Grant by Shoalhaven City Council. The grant is to supply the Council with 20 bird nest boxes for installation in local parks and gardens.

The objective of the grant is to replace habitat lost in the 2019/2020 fires and increase the population of target bird species in local urban areas. The increased presence of native birds will improve the ambience of adjoining residential areas, enhance the overall environment and improve the mental health of residents.

The target species will be Crimson Rosellas, although the boxes can also accommodate Eastern Rosellas, Lorikeets, Red Rump Parrots and Galahs. Ringtail possums and sugar gliders may also be attracted.

The project is scheduled for completion by March 2022 but we hope to commence acquisition of materials shortly so that we can start fabrication of the boxes as soon as we can re-open. We'll keep you advised here of progress and when delivery is finally made to Council.


