Message from Shelley Hancock

Bushfire Community Recovery and Resilience

Member for South Coast Shelley Hancock and Member for Kiama Gareth Ward today announced that Shoalhaven City Council will receive a payment of \$250,000 to support a range of local recovery and resilience projects, establishing a Bushfire Service and Information Hub, an enhanced recovery hotline and outreach and community grants for local organisations.

Communities in the Shoalhaven will benefit from funding dedicated to delivering projects and community grants programs via the Commonwealth and NSW Government's Bushfire Community Recovery and Resilience Fund (BCRRF), which provides more than \$25 million to promote community wellbeing, and disaster resilience in impacted areas.

The outcomes of this work will ensure the community has improved capacity and capability to respond to future disasters.

"We are still feeling the effects from last bushfire seasons and we will for quite some time but our communities are recovering and we are here to support the recovery and that is what this funding will do," Mrs Hancock said.

"Our towns and villages have become even closer following last bushfire season, with most working on plans to support the community in future natural disasters and this funding is aimed to help support and implement these plans," Mr Ward said.

Deputy Premier John Barilaro said these grants

focus on locally-led recovery and are an example of the continued financial assistance provided by the NSW Government.

"We are committed to supporting communities on the long road to recovery after last season's unprecedented bushfires. We know that when it comes to these types of projects locals know best, so we are empowering local communities to make best use of this funding.

"The \$250,000 will enable the local council to work with their community members on social recovery activities and locally-led initiatives to help communities recover."

The NSW Government remains committed to supporting everyone who has been impacted by bushfires.

If anyone has any questions about eligibility or requires support they are encouraged to contact the bushfire customer care line on 13 77 88, or visit the Service NSW website at www.service. nsw.gov.au.

Stream 2 of the \$25 million Bushfire Community Recovery and Resilience Fund has been extended to ensure that everyone has enough time to apply. Applications for Stream 2 of the program will now be accepted until 12pm on 11 December 2020. Applications can be submitted at www.emergency.nsw.gov.au

Community Church

December already, and Christmas almost upon us. A year of massive change and interruption; fires, floods and the covid-19 pandemic, all contributing to changing the way we live and act. Traditionally Christmas is a time of parties, family gatherings and holiday festivities; and for those who follow Jesus this is a time that we celebrate his birth. Over seven hundred years before Jesus' birth, the Prophet Isaiah proclaimed this message; ""Stop dwelling on the past. Don't even remember these former things. I am doing something brand new, something unheard of. Even now it sprouts and grows and matures. Don't you perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and open up flowing streams in the desert".

Jesus reading from that same prophecy says this of himself; "God's Spirit is on me;

he's chosen me to preach the Message of good news to the poor, sent me to announce pardon to prisoners and recovery of sight to the blind, to set the burdened and battered free, to announce, "This is God's year to act!"

Understanding the message of Christmas is simple – God understood we were in need of a "a new thing" and that left to our own devices, were unable to create "flowing streams in the desert", what was needed was someone who would show us how to live, and how to love. So, God became one of us, entered our world as the baby Jesus, born of a woman.

During Jesus mission on earth, his follower Luke records these words (from the message): "To you who are ready for the truth, I say this: Love your enemies. Let them bring out the best in you, not the worst. When someone gives you a hard time, respond with the energies of prayer for that person" ... "Live generously". "Here is a simple rule of thumb for behaviour: Ask yourself what you want people to do for you; then grab the initiative and do it for them! If you only love

the lovable, do you expect a pat on the back? Run-of-the-mill sinners do that. If you only help those who help you, do you expect a medal? Garden-variety sinners do that. If you only give for what you hope to get out of it, do you think that's charity? The stingiest of pawnbrokers does that. "I tell you, love your enemies. Help and give without expecting a return. You'll never—I promise—regret it. Live out this God-created identity the way our Father lives toward us, generously and graciously, even when we're at our worst. Our Father is kind; you be kind".

f we all lived this way, I wonder, what sort of community we would create? Perhaps in some ways the Christian church has taken its eyes of Jesus! My desire is that the church will become that source of living water that brings hope and life to those enduring a desert experience.

Bushcare

This month I want to feature one of our Bush Care sites, the area bounded by Callala Creek, the carpark at Bicentennial Park, and the footpath on Lackersteen St, ending at the small drain opposite Bay St. The two photos below show the area as you may have seen it from the footpath.





Our group first started working on this site in early 2015. We slashed the Buffalo and Kikuyu lawn grasses and then selectively sprayed herbicide when the grasses began to re shoot. Some of 'the usual suspects' in terms of weeds we encounter were also present; Senna or Easter Cassia, Asparagus fern, Thistle, Nightshade and Bidens Pilosa, or as it is commonly known,

Cobbler's pegs. They were removed by hand or by use of small hand tools.

After that initial work, a large volume of eucalyptus mulch, over 10 tonnes [!] was provided by the Council, and we set to work spreading this over the freshly cleared areas.

Then we sourced seedlings of small plants endemic to the area such as Lomandra longifolia, Crinum lilies and Ficinia nodosa/ Knobby club rush. Below is a photo of a couple of Crinum lilies, one of them in flower. The various ground covers and creepers in the background are what Bush Carers refer to as 'volunteers', that is, plants endemic to the area that germinate after we have cleared away weeds. I find watching 'volunteers' get a wriggle on at a Bush Care site extremely satisfying.



In the photo below, a 'volunteer' climber, Stephania japonica/snake vine, is strangling a young Crinum lily, well sorry Crinum lily, them's the breaks! Our aim in Bush Care is to try and foster a natural environment rather than a domestic garden layout, so a bit of strangling is OK!

Bushcare



Passer-by saw this creeper and asked me with concern if it was a weed. I think she worried that it was Madeira vine, a very vigorous invasive weed of South American origin. The leaves are similar, but a big difference is that with snake vine, the stem attaches to the leaf in the middle of the leaf, not at the edge.

Follow up sessions were done over the next couple of years, but one weed which rather snuck up on us is a pasture grass originally imported from South Africa as cattle fodder, Ehrharta erecta, or panic veldgrass. The introduction of this grass wasn't particularly useful to the agricultural sector because cattle here don't really favour this grass like their South African cousins do, and this grass rapidly becomes a weed as it produces viable seed all year round. We inadvertently created a nice environment for this weed not noticing its gradual encroachment once the eucalyptus mulch began to break down and the bare earth was exposed.

This photo shows a mature Ehrharta plant. As you can see, the seed heads stretch out well beyond the leaves, spreading trouble as they go!



Over the past few months we have devoted most of our weekly sessions [Tuesday mornings from 8am – 10am] to tackling this weed. It's painstaking work, and requires a certain level of fitness in terms of kneeling and bending. But mostly it requires a lot of patience. I don't really know why its common name is 'panic grass', but it certainly causes me to sigh with exasperation at times! Fortunately, there are enough indigenous plants now established that with time, patience, plus another large load of eucalyptus mulch, I'm confident we will bring 'the panic' under manageable control.

Eye Health from Peter Rose

Pterygia. A growing problem

A part from other dangers to your vision, exposure to the suns harmful rays can cause pterygia to form on the eyes. A pterygium (pronounced te-ri-gi-um) (plural: pterygia) is not a form of cancer but a fleshy growth on the eye. It can be ugly, uncomfortable and affect vision. As with any changes that occurs to your eyes or vision, detection of a pterygium requires an immediate eye examination.

A pterygium is a triangular-shaped lump of tissue that grows from the thin membrane that covers the white of the eye, the conjunctiva. The pterygium can grow over the cornea. The condition often occurs in both eyes, usually on the nasal sides of the conjunctiva and cornea. It is brought on by exposure to the sun but its exact causes are not known. The condition is strongly associated with ultra-violet radiation and hot, dry environments. Pterygium is most common among farmers and surfers and those who spend a lot of time outside, especially in

Light can be blocked from the eye if the pterygium grows onto the central part of the cornea and vision can be distorted. When the pterygium is not growing on to the cornea, protection from ultraviolet light can stabilize growth and further treatment may not be needed.

northern Australia.

When the pterygium is actively growing on the cornea, surgical removal is the most effective treatment. Your optometrist can assess the pterygium and refer you to an eye surgeon if it needs to be removed. It is relatively minor surgery that is usually performed under local anesthetic.

To prevent pterygia, follow the basic sun protection guidelines: avoid the sun between 10am and 4pm, and wear a broad-brimmed hat and wrap around sunglasses when in the sun.

Hello everyone November 21st was our last meeting until we resume on February 20th. It has been a difficult year for everyone, but we managed to restart our meetings again in September. This pandemic changed our lives and has taught us to be patient, resilient and flexible. We hope that next year we will be COVID-19 free and everyone will be able to meet without any restrictions.

Our garden club is affiliated with Garden Clubs of Australia Inc and this year they celebrated 70 years. The founding president was Margaret Davis, a woman with vision. Margaret was born in 1908, her birth registered at Katoomba, New South Wales. She married Arthur Davis in 1929 at Vaucluse. She was the second woman to hold a pilot's licence in Australia, Nancy Bird Walton being the first.

She founded the NSW Garden Club in 1950 which later became The Garden Clubs of Australia in 1952 with the 'Friendship through Gardens'. She also began the concept of the Remembrance Driveway, a living war memorial consisting of tree planting in designated areas along the highway connecting Sydney and Canberra, to honour Australian Serviceman and women.

Margaret Davis died in 2000 but her legacy lives on as there are now 740 affiliated garden clubs around Australia. Her husband Arthur M Davis created a camellia in honour of his wife Camellia japonica 'Margaret Davis'. This camellia produces a display of dense foliage and creamy white flowers with bright rose petal margins. It makes a striking hedge and can also be grown in a pot.



On behalf of our garden club, I would like to thank the Callala Bay Community Association especially editor Jake Khourey for their continued support.

We wish everyone a happy Christmas and Peace and joy in the coming year. Take care everyone and stay safe. Go and enjoy your garden!

Culburra Beach & District Men's Shed

The 2019/20 summer bushfires were an experience we will all never forget. The NSW South Coast, including areas nearby to us, was devastated. The impact on local properties, agriculture and grazing, small and large businesses, hospitality and tourism, and our environment was indeed profound. Many are yet to recover.

Our local flora and fauna suffered massive damage. Estimates vary but all agree that literally millions of native mammals, birds and reptiles were killed by the fires. Those that survived were faced with greatly reduced habitat and a loss of food resources. The bush will regenerate in time but many animals will suffer in the vacuum left behind by the fires. This is particularly true regarding the loss of older, hollow bearing trees which are usually more than 100 years old before fungus, borers or trauma create natural hollows for birds, possums, reptiles and bees.

The fires exacerbated the ongoing loss of natural habitat from urbanisation, forestry and agricultural land clearing. We are fortunate to live in an area where wildlife like possums and native birds in our backyards is commonplace. Now, more than ever, our local wildlife need help. Something as simple as putting out water for local birds, lizards and bees will help. So will planting endemic native plants in the garden to provide flowers, nectar and safe roosting places for birds.

If you have trees in your backyard, you could also consider putting up a nest box for local birds and/or possums. Our Men's Shed makes a range of nest boxes, suitable for birds ranging from rosellas and galahs, to kookaburras and owls, to musk lorikeets and pardalotes. We also make nest boxes for brush-tail and ringtail possums, sugar and feather-tail gliders and antechinus. In many cases, the same box may be used by either a possum or a bird, dependent on

location and orientation e.g. ringtail possums will

use the same box as crimson rosellas. Installation height should be about 4 to 5 metres for most birds and 3 metres or above for possum species. Safety first rules; never climb higher than you feel safe and always seek assistance when installing nest boxes. Nest boxes should be located to avoid exposure to the western sun as summer heat can be a killer for young chicks.

Please think about installing a bird or possum box in your backyard this summer. As well as providing habitat for our local wildlife, the antics of the nesting birds (or possums in the early evening) can be both entertaining and educational

Landcare

"Environment wins from Fulton Hogan & Landcare collaboration.

Anyone who has driven through Nowra in the past few months would have noticed the road widening work on the Princes Highway as part of the new Nowra Bridge project. This has resulted in the removal of a number of trees adjacent to the Shoalhaven City Council buildings, Harry Sawkins Park, and Illaroo Road. Many locals have been wondering what is happening with these trees.

Fulton Hogan, the contractor for the Nowra Bridge project, has collaborated with the Shoalhaven Landcare Association and Tapitallee Creek Landcare group to reuse the logs and rootballs in bank stabilisation work. They have delivered the timber to specific sites, ready for installation.

Tapitallee Creek Landcare Group has been actively working to stabilise and revegetate the creeks and wetlands in the Cambewarra area since 1992. During this time, they have undertaken numerous projects involving bank stabilisation using rock and logs, construction of bed lowering structures such as weirs, re- established ephemeral wetlands throughout the floodplain and extensive revegetation of the riparian areas, planting over 14,000 native trees. This project has become an example to other Landcare groups working on riparian land in the region.

The lower reaches of Tapitallee Creek experience huge flows after rain, which causes significant bank erosion. In 2018 the group sourced root balls and logs to stabilise a seriously eroded bank on the creek.

"With the help of Soil Conservation Service, we were able to stabilise the bank by pushing the trunk of the root balls into the bank and securing them with 6 metre long logs." Said Peter Jirgens, President of the Landcare Group.

"The entire structure was secured with galvanised steel cable, making it permanent and robust to floods. These structures form excellent habitat for water species such as fish, eels, amphibians and other riparian species." He added

"Last year, we worked with local volunteers and planted over 700 plants on the banks including River Oak trees, Red Cedars, Cabbage Tree Palms, Lomandras and native lilies which will help prevent riverbank erosion, improve water quality and provide habitat for native wildlife."" said landholder Sal Bruderlin

"The logs and root balls donated by Fulton Hogan will allow us to stabilise more eroding sections of Tapitallee Creek on two properties, with assistance from Soil Conservation Service." Said Mr Jirgens"

Out and About Voucher Program

Member for South Coast Shelley Hancock has welcomed yesterday's announcement NSW residents will be given \$100 worth of digital vouchers that can be used at eateries and on arts and tourism attractions across NSW.

Mrs Hancock said the vouchers are part of a flagship \$500 million program to help business, stimulate the State's economy and support local jobs and will bring a much needed boost to local businesses affected by fires, drought and the pandemic.

"With residents across the South Coast enduring multiple natural disasters in the past 12 months preventing us from going out to dinner, visiting local attractions or taking our children or grandchildren to the cinema, these vouchers will help our local residents and businesses," Mrs Hancock said.

Treasurer Dominic Perrottet said the \$500 million Out & About program is designed to boost businesses hit hard by the pandemic, by encouraging people to get out and enjoy the best of NSW.

"No industry has felt the economic impacts of COVID-19 more than the hospitality, arts and tourism industries," Mr Perrottet said.

"NSW acted swiftly to save lives and stop the spread of COVID-19 and we want to help businesses by encouraging spending within local communities, especially within the hospitality, arts and tourism sectors."

Every NSW resident aged 18 and over will be eligible for four \$25 vouchers worth \$100 in total - with the program designed to encourage people to spend multiple times to support their

local businesses.


