## Presidents Report

The April CBCA General meeting was well attended, and a few new members were ratified. We welcomed our new Secretary- John Byron – and our new Treasurer- Mark Bennie- to their roles. Thank you so much for taking on the task and given your experiences in past lives I know you will bring expertise and commitment to the roles.

Councilor Patricia White – Assistant Deputy Mayor- was in attendance and gave some very helpful insights into organisational changes within SCC and the many major pieces of work Council is undertaking to prepare the Shoalhaven for the future. Our Ward Councilors and Councilor White will be invited to future meetings to help us understand the priorities for Council and to allow the Callala Bay community to talk about the issues we are concerned about with them.

The CBCA Committee placed two notices of motion on the agenda- one dealing with the frequency of general meetings of the CBCA and one dealing with membership of the CBCA as a result of some discussion at the March meeting.

The changes recommended to Section 26 (1) of the CBCA Rules regarding the frequency of General Meetings- from monthly to a minimum of 6 meetings per year with additional meetings convened if required- was discussed at length and then put to the vote. It was passed by the meeting attendees but due to a rule requiring 75% of financial members of the CBCA to agree to amend the CBCA Rules it was decided that a postal vote of financial members would be undertaken prior to changes being made. This will occur in the next few weeks. Financial members should ensure that they vote.

The other motion regarding who could be a member of the CBCA was also discussed at length by the attendees and has been returned to the CBCA Committee for further work on the wording. The CBCA Committee is aiming for an inclusive and welcoming community association which provides an opportunity for diverse views to be heard. More on this over the next little while.

The attendees at the meeting were supportive of the CBCA 'hosting' more social events for the community and there will be work done on the first of these by the CBCA Committee in the coming weeks.

A working group has been established to follow up previous work done on a proposal for a path to the water along Sheaffe St from Lackersteen St. The group will be working with SCC to ensure it has a place in Council's pathways budget. Hopefully progress will be made.

A lot is happening behind the scenes with our new committee, the members of which will be introduced progressively over coming editions of the News. In the meantime, if you see us around, please have a chat and let us know what's on your mind.

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## Bushcare

I am not a fan of cooler weather, but the last hurrah of the mosquitoes around Callala this April has almost had me wishing for a dip in the mercury. Almost! And dodging mozzies at our Bush Care sites near creeks and wetlands has been quite testing for the Callala Bush Care crew.

One big boost we received a few weeks ago was a large load of mulch delivered by Council to the Bush Care site at the end of Lackersteen St. It only took a couple of hours, and six Bush Care workers wielding wheel barrows, rakes and mulch forks, and the mulch had been spread around the site. Another load of mulch has been ordered to be delivered later in the year.

Most of the remaining weeds on this site are small - but reducing their prevalence to 'maintenance' level will require a lot of patience-testing work over at least the next couple of years. The reason for this is that there is a great deal of seed of these weeds – like Veldt Panic Grass and Milk Thistle - in the topsoil. So it is not simply a matter of removing these weeds once, areas must be cleared of weeds over, and over again. It's a good thing that I find weeding a relaxing exercise – this site gives me a lot of scope for relaxation!

The exciting thing for me about this site is watching as it 'regenerates'. The mass of green in the foreground of this photo is an indigenous vine, *Parsonsia straminea*, or Common Silkpod.



There are also Native Basket Grasses and two types of Native Couch grass in the area. These grasses are less vigorous than the Silkpod vine, but they are covering more and more of the site as the weeds are removed. What I was aiming to capture in this next photo was an image of an area of a patch of the edible native ground cover known as Warrigal Greens, with the blue of the creek behind it. The bonus was looking through the viewfinder and seeing a Crimson Rosella eating some of the greens.



One weed which we have eliminated from this site is the vigorous climber known as Moth Vine. I found this specimen growing just beyond the drain which is the border of the site. When I followed the main stem of this vine down into the thick Buffalo Grass, I was surprised to find that it extended nearly four metres before I found the point that it disappeared into the ground. I carefully cut the stem and applied a gel-type herbicide at ground level. The milky sap of this plant requires a gooey type poison.

Then I removed the rest of the vine which was winding its way up a Casuarina. Sometimes we leave these vines to disintegrate up in the trees, but in this case there were ripe pods on the vine that needed to be disposed of before they could release what would have been masses of fine seeds.

## Community Church

Perhaps the saying "having a clean slate" has lost its meaning in today's world as it has been a long time since we wrote on slate tablets; (in Australia writing on a slate tablet at school was a common practice from during the 18th century and being phased out around the beginning of the 20th ), we still hear the saying used today. What does it mean? Of course, today we use the delete button on our computer when what we write isn't up to scratch, then start again. Not a difficult thing to do when completing an assignment or sending an e-mail. What about having a clean slate in life? We understand if we get a few demerit points on our driver's licence, that after a specified time we get those points back; or, in other words the slate is wiped clean.

On a different note, sometimes during our journey through life we acquire memories of things we have done that we are not proud of;

or things we failed to do that brought pain to others. Most of the time we are able to suppress these thoughts, but somewhere deep down we feel the sense of guilt, or shame and would love to have the slate wiped clean.

My experience as a follower of Jesus is that, in him, I get to have a clean slate; it is also good if possible, to put right the wrongs I have committed or omitted; not withstanding that I know in Jesus the slate is wiped clean; Jesus paid the penalty with his own life on the cross. Luke, the gospel writer gives us the story of Zacchaeus, a dishonest tax collector, a man despised within his community. Jesus is criticized for going to Zacchaeus' house for a meal; though from this meeting Zacchaeus is transformed into repaying what he ripped off from others and giving generously to the poor. The slate is wiped clean and a new life is now possible. This is what Jesus wants for each of us. The Apostle Paul writing to the church at Rome writes; "Your old sin-loving nature was buried with him by baptism when he died; and when God the Father, with glorious power, brought him back to life again, you were given his wonderful new life to enjoy". And John writing about Jesus tells us: "He entered into the world he created, yet the world was unaware. He came to the people he created — to those who should have received him, but they did not recognize him. But those who embraced him and took hold of his name he gave authority to become the children of God!"

This Jesus desires to do for all people no matter what!

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## Garden Club Report

At our April meeting we remembered Don Silcox who passed away on Good Friday. A member for a long time, he attended meetings regularly with his wife Shirley. Don was a true gentleman and a good sport. We will miss him very much.

President Bev welcomed guest speaker Rush Flanagan; a lady deeply passionate about the impact plastic bottles are having on the environment. Rush is the founder and designer of swimsuits and trades under the brand name Peppermint Pebbles. While investigating the damage plastic drink bottles are making, she discovered that a fabric was being produced from recycled plastic bottles. She wrote to the company recycling bottles into fabric, got on board and is now one of the 21 brands that has been signed up. The plastic bottles are collected, formed into chips, they are then heated in silos and whipped into fibres which turns into yarn.

This procedure has no effect on our atmosphere as no chemicals are released. The yarn is sent to factories where it is turned into material. Rush imports this material to make costumes for all age groups and each one tells you how many bottles were used. Her bags used to package her swimsuits are made from food scraps and safe for worms to eat. Rush is determined not to use plastic bags when shopping for fruit and vegetables. Instead, she makes bags by gluing shopping fliers together. Rush also told us that instead of buying shampoo and conditioner in bottles, she uses bars which come in a paper bag. We loved listening to Rush, and it made us think about the plastic we use at home. ## Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ)

We held our inaugural Open Day on Easter Saturday and were pleased to receive so many visitors. Some came to browse our products for sale; some came just to have a closer look at the shed; some were keen to meet the Shed members and share a yarn or two; some were potential new members with lots of questions.

In this article, we will try to answer some of these FAQ, as follows:-

### Q. When are you open?

A. Our Shed is open from 8am to 1pm on Mondays and Wednesdays (public holidays excepted). We usually take a short break over the Christmas/New Year period.

### Q. How often do I need to attend?

A. Some members attend every day we're open. Some attend once a week. Others less frequently. It's entirely up to the member. We obviously encourage regular attendance for the many benefits; but we equally recognise that individual's circumstances differ.



### Q. How much does it cost?

A. Annual membership is \$35. This primarily covers our insurance. Our financial year runs from

November to October, and fees are adjusted pro rata for those who join mid-year. There is also a daily charge of \$3 for each attendance to cover lunch, tea/coffee and refreshments.

### Q. What skills do I need?

A. Our members come from a variety of backgrounds, with differing skill sets, from no experience to trade level. There are no pre-requisites and those with trade backgrounds are always willing to help and guide their fellow members. Everyone contributes in his own way.

### Q. What tools and equipment do you have?

A. Our equipment includes wood and metal lathes, pedestal drills, band saws, drop saws, a table saw, belt sanders, routers and grinders, a thicknesser, plus welding and cutting gear. We also use a wide range of power and hand tools.

### Q. Can I bring in projects from home?

A. Of course you can. And it's almost guaranteed that another member has had the same project and can provide helpful tips. Our benches and tools are probably superior to your home workshop, so the job will be done better and faster. It's also possible to take Shed tools home on loan if you lack a particular tool.

### Q. What activities are available?

A. This varies with each person's wishes. We try to cover individual self-projects, community projects for local organisations, and creating items for sale (to order, at the Shed door, or through local markets). These sales cover the cost of materials and allow us to continually improve the Shed.

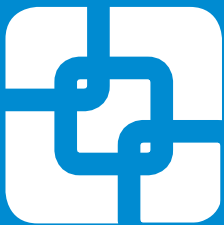

## Callala Yoga

Are you looking for a way to unwind, relax and find a little more peace in your daily life? Would you like to enjoy gentle physical challenges in a safe and nurturing environment?

Do you want to be part of a fantastic, welcoming local yoga community?

If the answer to any of these questions is YES, then please read on!

Callala Yoga currently offers three classes per

week – a Flow, Slow Flow and Yin. Depending on your timetable and physical needs there is something here to suit most bodies. The Flow class is our most dynamic class and includes downward dogs, sun salutes, backbends and play with various poses. This class can sometimes work up a sweat! Students are always offered gentle variations and poses to suit differing abilities. Many of our students are over 60 and do extremely well in this class.

However, if you've got recent injuries, have never practiced yoga, or are after something more relaxing you may want to consider one of our other classes on offer. Slow Flow is a gentler version of our Flow class. Moves are broken down more here and the pace is a little slower as the name suggests. We also offer more challenging options in this class for experienced yogis.

Finally, our Yin class is really special. In this class you'll hold poses on the mat for several minutes, often with the support of a bolster or large pillow. This class helps to increase joint mobility, lengthen connective tissue and restore the nervous system. Yin is supremely relaxing, but can also be challenging at times. It's our most gentle practice and works a little like a moving meditation. Students always float out of this class.

At the moment, all of our classes are available for students to walk in without booking.

Classes are held at the Callala Beach Community Hall at 89 Quay Rd, Callala Beach.

Classes are \$15 casual or you can purchase class passes, 5 for \$70 or 10 for \$130.

Class times are Tues 9.15am Flow, Wed 5.30pm Yin, Thurs 8.15am Slow Flow.

All classes run for 90 minutes. Please BYO mat, and bring a bolster or large pillow for Yin.

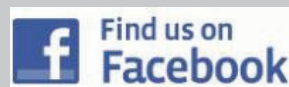

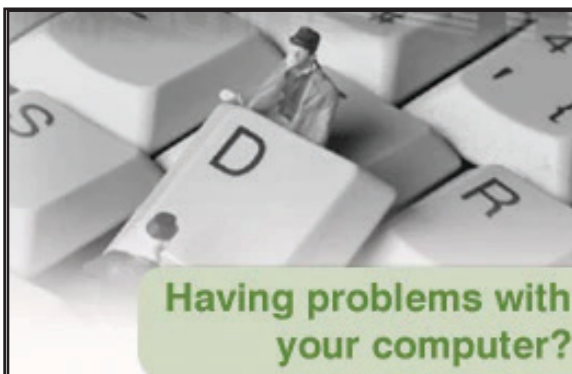
