Callala Medical Centre

For those who has come in during the vaccination clinics at Callala medical centre lately, we have been very busy with COVID-19 and influenza vaccinations. Due to social distancing rules, the immunisation process has been longer and more trickier than previous years. We are slowly getting through everyone and we appreciate everyone's patience during this period.

For those who are interested, anyone who is 50 years or older is now eligible for the COVID-19 vaccination, and we are taking on patients who are not our own for the immunisation program as we understand not all practices are giving the vaccinations.

We also have plenty of influenza for people over the age of 65 years old or has a significant medical condition.

If you are interested in the COVID-19 vaccination but is younger than 50 years old, then the eligibility checker website from the government will have updates about locations of the Pfizer vaccine. (at the time of writing, it is being updated).

Bushcare

Earlier this year the highly regarded botanist and ecologist, Dr Kevin Mills who is based in the Illawarra, visited Callala and provided an informal assessment of the plants in the area along Callala Creek from the Bicentennial Park end back towards Chapman St. Dr Mills was impressed by the rich variety of the plants he observed. He thoughtfully provided our Bush Care group with a list of just some of the plants he noted. The list is a page and a half long, I could add another half page of the more com-

mon plants Dr Mills didn't bother to note. If anyone would like this list, please contact me, details at end of this column.

When I look along the creek and drain line, I see 'mangroves'. But Dr Mills was able to distinguish both the more common Grey Mangroves, and the less common River Mangrove. The latter are growing further up the creek bank where the water is less saline. Similarly, our group could see native couch regenerating in the areas near Bicentennial Park where we have done most weeding and mulching. Dr Mills was able to distinguish the rarer Salt Couch which is a finer grass and is found close to the creek.

The most exciting find from Dr Mills' point of view was a number of small plants, less than a metre high growing on the creek bank. When our Council supervisor Belinda Stewart drew Dr Mills' attention to these he was able to identify them as a plant rarely found not only in the Shoalhaven, but the entire South Coast. It's called Sea Lavender or Limonium austral. Pictured below.



Bushcare

The largest of these rare plants has now set seed and Belinda and I have collected some of this seed and it will be propogated at the SCC Bush Care Nursery at Crookhaven Heads and then hopefully, some seedlings can be returned and planted near the existing Sea Lavender on the bank of our creek.

One of the big weed issues for our group in the bushland along Lackersteen St is the intrusion of lawn grasses like Buffalo and Kikuyu. I assume – someone who has lived here since before the footpath was built will probably know for sure – that when landscaping was done after the path was laid, it involved seeding these lawn grasses. Unfortunately, as is their habit, their runners have spread right into the bush, in parts almost to the creek. Bush Care work is being done at present to remove the lawn grasses from around the trunks of trees near the footpath, and general thinning of the lawn grasses has revealed more of the natural diverse plants. Among these are Maiden Hair Fern and a local fishbone type fern, Blechmum ambiguum. Hopefully our regeneration efforts will result in a more interesting vista for those walking along the footpath.



Garden Club Report

Hi everyone, our club received a wonderful boost in May when Shoalhaven Council gave us a \$1000 donation to help our club recover after Covid 19. A chance meeting with Deputy Mayor, Mr Greg Watson at the Callala Community Garden Opening day, President Bev, and I took the opportunity to talk to him about our club's financial situation. He put in a motion at their Council meeting, and we received the donation. As we are a non -profit organisation we rely on membership fees, sales from our trading table and raffle. Unfortunately, our membership numbers are dwindling but we are always optimistic that things will turn around. We are so grateful to Councillor

Watson and the Shoalhaven Council. President Bev welcomed guest speaker Mr Simon Gilmore from Nowra Groovy Plants. Simon is a hobby grower of carnivorous plants such as Venus Fly traps, Pitcher plants and Sundews. He was selling his plants at Berry Markets, but due to Covid he started to sell from home. What is a carnivorous plant? It is a plant that lives in soil low in nutrients (ie. nitrogen, phosphorus, and potassium) and trap, capture and digest insects.

These plants cannot be planted in home gardens as they are overly sensitive to any nutrients in the soil. They need to be planted in peat moss and sand (washed thoroughly) or pearlite to a 50/50 ratio. After potting, they need to be in wet soil, the pot needs to be in full sun sitting in a tray with 1/3 water. These carnivorous plants are also sensitive to salt, so water quality is essential. Simon gave us a pictorial presentation of the different species that can be grown and their hip names - Wacky Traps, Pink Venus, Sawtooth, B52 Micro Mini and Fondue to name a few.




Culburra Beach & Districts Men's Shed

Love them or hate them, possums are a part of Australian life. Like all of our native animals, they are suffering from natural habitat loss and predation by feral animals. All Australian native fauna is protected, including possums.

If you have a possums living in your roof, garage or shed, it is because they have no other option. To give them a home of their own, perhaps providing a suitable nest box is a worthwhile option for you (and the possum).

Brushtail possum

This species most commonly tries to find a home in your roof space. They are the largest of the local species and need quite a large box, with an opening of 100mm or larger. Females will occupy their nest box almost permanently during daylight hours, whereas males move around. They are omnivorous and very adaptable and will sometimes take over parrot boxes by enlarging the entry hole. Mounting height of about 3 to 4 metres is desirable but a quiet location, free from lights, traffic and disturbance, is the most important factor for successful rehoming.



Ringtail possum

Another adaptive local, they will use a deeper nest box with a 75mm opening, sometimes at quite low heights, located in a sheltered quiet spot. Herbivorous, and feeding mainly on fresh eucalyptus shoots, they cause little disturbance in gardens and can be very entertaining in their acrobatics.

Sugar glider

With their unique gliding abilities, and renowned sweet tooth, these small possums are happiest in forests, where they are effective pollinators of nectar rich plants. They prefer to operate high in the tree canopy, seldom coming to ground, but will come into urban backyards. A small opening of 40 or 50mm is required and a deep box, mounted above 4 metres is preferred. They live in family groups and like to huddle together away from any draught or rain, particularly in the cold of winter.

Feathertail glider.

These very small creatures feature a beautiful tail, much longer than their small bodies. Operating high in the tree canopy, they are also great pollinators, vulnerable to habitat loss and suffering badly from predation by cats. Their nest box opening is only 25 mm to keep out daytime predators like snakes and goannas, and they are too need winter protection from cold and draughts.

Pygmy possum

Sometimes mistaken for a mouse, most of these small possum species are endangered. They operate at lower heights but need lots of natural cover and hiding spaces to avoid predation by feral and domestic animals. They use the same nest box as feathertail gliders or antechinus, with a small 25mm opening,

We make nest boxes for all of the above possums. Please call in for a visit or ring us on 0499 452095 for more information. We'll also be at the Callala Markets on 12 June.

Callala Yoga

Are you looking for a way to unwind, relax and find a little more peace in your daily life? Would you like to enjoy gentle physical challenges in a safe and nurturing environment?

Do you want to be part of a fantastic, welcoming local yoga community?

If the answer to any of these questions is YES, then please read on!

Callala Yoga currently offers three classes per week – a Flow, Slow Flow and Yin. Depending on your timetable and physical needs there is something here to suit most bodies. The Flow class is our most dynamic class and includes downward dogs, sun salutes, backbends and

play with various poses. This class can sometimes work up a sweat! Students are always offered gentle variations and poses to suit differing abilities. Many of our students are over 60 and do extremely well in this class.

However, if you've got recent injuries, have never practiced yoga, or are after something more relaxing you may want to consider one of our other classes on offer. Slow Flow is a gentler version of our Flow class. Moves are broken down more here and the pace is a little slower as the name suggests. We also offer more challenging options in this class for experienced yogis.

Finally, our Yin class is really special. In this class you'll hold poses on the mat for several minutes, often with the support of a bolster or large pillow. This class helps to increase joint mobility, lengthen connective tissue and restore the nervous system. Yin is supremely relaxing, but can also be challenging at times. It's our most gentle practice and works a little like a moving meditation. Students always float out of this class.

At the moment, all of our classes are available for students to walk in without booking. Classes are held at the Callala Beach Community Hall at 89 Quay Rd, Callala Beach. Classes are \$15 casual or you can purchase class passes, 5 for \$70 or 10 for \$130. Class times are Tues 9.15am Flow, Wed 5.30pm Yin, Thurs 8.15am Slow Flow.

All classes run for 90 minutes. Please BYO mat, and bring a bolster or large pillow for Yin. We would absolutely love to see you no matter your age, gender or ability.



Community Story Corner

Callala Bay Progress Hall – a story of community. It started with a goose, and was saved by a broken fire truck...



In December 1963, the few permanent residents of Callala Bay, many avid fishing folk, decided to form a Progress Association. The Progress Association held its first meeting on 2 January 1964 and passed a motion that 'Council be approached for a grant of a suitably located block of land for a Community Hall.' Their very first fundraising activity towards this ambition was to raffle a goose that had been donated for the cause.

The goose raffle tickets must have sold well, because the proceeds plus donations from the Bay residents raised enough money to pay the deposit on a piece of land running from Boorawine Terrace to Morton Street at a land auction held by Council just nine days later, on 11 January 1964. The deposit was £20 (\$40) on the land that sold for £460 (\$920). While the Progress Association did not get a grant to pay for the land, Council agreed that the balance of the money could be paid off over ten years, interest free.

Celebrations marking the 'gala opening of Callala Bay's Progress Association' were held on February 16. The local Nowra newspaper reported:

'For the opening, the [Shoalhaven] Town Band, and visiting Marching Girls, the Fairy Meadow

Majorettes, combined to provide entertainment, while the Senior Citizens provided the merry-go-round and other needed amenities for the afternoon's programme.'

So now the fledgling Progress Association was the proud owner of a piece of land for the hall, but the hall itself took many more years to eventuate.

First, there was the problem of raising funds to build a hall while at the same time having to pay off the land, and meanwhile paying rates on the land. It was a big ask for such a small community, but it is amazing what they accomplished.

Fundraising began at once with raffles, street stalls, and film and housie evenings held in people's houses and garages. By the end of 1964, locals had raised the sum of £250 (\$500) towards the hall, which is a remarkable achievement. (The gala alone had raised £35.7.10 [\$70.71]). Draft plans were drawn up. But ongoing costs on the land kept draining the Association's funds and so finally in 1967 the Progress Association came up with a clever plan to avoid paying rates and taxes on the land. They decided to approach Council with a proposal to transfer the ownership of the land to Council, and for Council then to make the land available on trust to the Progress Association to build a hall.

A motion was passed at a Progress Association General Meeting on 28 January 1967 to 'transfer lots 9/10 section 20 to Council of land to be made available to erect a hall, submit plans of hall to Council and proceed generally to go ahead with a loan in this matter'. The motion was carried unanimously.


