### **Community Church**

As we say goodbye to the disruptions and struggles of 2020, I wonder if we have learnt something? Are there lessons learnt that we take into this new year?

In reflection and speaking to others, one thing learnt is the importance of relationships, the pandemic helps us appreciate family and friends. Technology has brought us new ways of communicating, I have been to so many Zoom meetings, even attended a family birthday in another state, a good experience, although I missed out on the cake! Speaking with some other Pastors I heard that on line church services had actually increased weekly service attendance; not forgetting that listeners could join the on-line service in their PJs, with coffee in hand.

There are of course many areas that we have missed, and so much suffering and death, and the devastation to Australia's economy. As I ponder over all this, what stands out, the plans, made last year were no longer in play; in a matter of weeks the world as I knew it had changed, much that was taken for granted no longer existed, we entered areas not experienced in my lifetime. Different, but similar to generations that lived through the two world wars, the great depression, or the Spanish flu pandemic.

I appreciate the benefits science has given; the receiver of a pacemaker, I am thankful for our modern medicine and its ongoing development, and the multitude of labour-saving devices, along with new devices or gadgets that entertain us. listening to friends and family, I'm not sure these advances are really making us any happier. Where might we see God in all that is going on? Why is the world so unpredictable and often filled with terror?

Scientists developing artificial intelligence, concede that computers can't feel. Morton Hunt in his exploration of the limits of artificial intelligence concludes; "Maybe the biggest difference between artificial and human intelligence is just that simple: we care about the things we choose to do. Solving new problems, discovering new facts, visiting a new place, reading a new book; all make us feel good; that's why we do them. But how would one make a computer feel good?"

God in his wisdom gives us freedom, created in his image means that we are free to make choices, often with severe consequences. Maybe the mess we see is a result of human mismanagement and the decision to live as if God doesn't exist.

Philip Yancey's book, A Sceptic's Guide to Faith, writes; "Eternity is destiny, concludes the one who looks up. Our genes may indeed contain predispositions towards bestial instincts, but we hear a call to rise above them... [Studying behaviour of ants] you could stare at an anthill a long time before coming up with a list of qualities: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. Yet Paul holds these up as proof of the presence of God in a person's life, the "fruit of the Spirit." Where God lives, these qualities flourish.

May this year bring peace and purpose to you all!

### **Bushcare Report**

I have to admit that a downside to being a very keen Bush Care volunteer, is that I do tend to look at landscape and see what I regard as weeds before I see the natural beauty. I really became aware of this rather backwards view of looking at natural areas when I holidayed in Scotland. It was something of a relief not to know which plants were regarded as 'weeds', and just allow my eyes to soak up the vista of the landscape.

So rather than focussing on weeds, ie plants that don't belong in the natural areas in Callala, this month I thought I'd remark on some of the beautiful creeper style plants that we do find here.

Back in September I was wandering through the Emmett St Reserve behind my home, with camera in hand. I met a couple who said to me, 'you should take a photo of the Hardenbergia violacea at the Lackersteen St entrance to the Reserve.' I'm glad they said that because the plant, which was sprawling over a couple of metres, was in full purple flower, and looked spectacular. There are a couple of common names for this plant, but my favourite is Happy Wanderer. This plant thrives in our clay soil.



The red and black flowers on the right of the photo are Kennedia rubicunda, or Dusky Coral Pea. This vine is found growing throughout the Emmett St/Boorawine Creek Reserve as is a less robust member of the same species, with the more fun name of Running Postman. Given it is local, I have planted Dusky Cora Pea vines along my fence line which abuts the Reserve. However the Brush-Tailed possums habitually conduct severe pruning of these vines along the top of the mesh fence, which also seems to involve eating many of the flowers.

Another climbing plant found in the Emmett St Reserve is Hibbertia scandens the common name is Golden Guinea Flower which is a bit confusing since it is definitely a Callala local!



The first round of this plants flowers have finished now, but I can see buds forming for a January cover of yellow.

The final vine/climber is Commelina cyanea. This weak climber can be confused with the more robust weed known as Wandering Jew/ Trad. The most noticeable difference is that the Commelina flowers are blue and the Trad flowers are white.

### Culburra Beach & Districts Men's Shed

Reduce, Re-use, Recycle.

This concept is increasingly one of the key components of environmental protection in our everyday lives. Our oceans are choking with plastic, our air quality is diminished daily from various sources, and landfill opportunities are approaching their limits.



So anything we can do to reduce wastage, re-use second hand materials or recycle the component parts of old furniture and equipment is worthwhile.

Harvesting old growth native forests is no longer acceptable due to the inherent destruction of habitat for our native wildlife. These forests are a valuable weapon against climate change and global warming; effectively the "lungs of the planet".

The use of 'sustainable' timber is critical at our Men's Shed because most of the products we produce are timber based. We rely on donations as much as possible for our raw material, but whenever we need to purchase timber we insist on certified Forestry Sustainable (FSC) products.

We use recycled pallets for projects like native bee hotels. The key issue here is that the pallets are 'HT' (heat treated), not chemically treated, so there is no toxic threat to the bees. Similarly, we never use treated pine for any wildlife related projects.

Second hand hardwood fence palings are another valuable resource. This timber is extremely durable and ideal for outside use. It can be very striking once sanded back to reveal the hidden grain and colour. Of course, the raw 'shabby chic' look can also be very attractive in the right location.

'Off cuts' of quality timber are always welcome. We have been fortunate enough to recently receive some of this material from a local staircase builder and window manufacturer. Timber yards and hardware stores can also be valuable sources.

In addition to the native bee hotels, microbat flats and nest boxes referred to in earlier articles, our Men's Shed produces a range of timber products for both indoor and outdoor use. From garden wishing wells to children's rocking horses; planter boxes, coat racks, wall shelving units; toys and novelties. There's bound to be something to catch your interest.



Please contact us if you have any suitable timber that we can re-use. As most of our projects are for outdoor use, solid hardwood or pine is best. We cannot use particle board, MDF, chipboard, Masonite or anything that will not cope with moisture.

## **Eye Health from Peter Rose**

#### Pterygia. A growing problem

A part from other dangers to your vision, exposure to the suns harmful rays can cause pterygia to form on the eyes. A pterygium (pronounced te-ri-gi-um) (plural: pterygia) is not a form of cancer but a fleshy growth on the eye. It can be ugly, uncomfortable and affect vision. As with any changes that occurs to your eyes or vision, detection of a pterygium requires an immediate eye examination.

A pterygium is a triangular-shaped lump of tissue that grows from the thin membrane that covers the white of the eye, the conjunctiva. The pterygium can grow over the cornea. The condition often occurs in both eyes, usually on the nasal sides of the conjunctiva and cornea.

It is brought on by exposure to the sun but its exact causes are not known. The condition is strongly associated with ultra-violet radiation and hot, dry environments. Pterygium is most common among farmers and surfers and those who spend a lot of time outside, especially in northern Australia.

Light can be blocked from the eye if the pterygium grows onto the central part of the cornea and vision can be distorted. When the pterygium is not growing on to the cornea, protection from ultraviolet light can stabilize growth and further treatment may not be needed.

When the pterygium is actively growing on the cornea, surgical removal is the most effective treatment. Your optometrist can assess the pterygium and refer you to an eye surgeon if it needs to be removed. It is relatively minor surgery that is usually performed under local anesthetic.

To prevent pterygia, follow the basic sun protection guidelines: avoid the sun between 10am and 4pm, and wear a broad-brimmed hat and wrap around sunglasses when in the sun. ### **Garden Club**

Hello everyone, Happy New Year! We are now in recess until we resume on Saturday 20 th February. We' re keeping optimistic that we will return COVID-19 free and be able to invite all our members and visitors to our meetings once again without any restrictions.

At our last meeting we proudly wore a corsage made up of flowers from our garden as the Display table was non -existent due to 'you know what rules'. I wore a Hoya carsoma also known as the wax flower. Recently a friend trimmed her Hoya and gave me the pieces which I struck in potting mix. I then transplanted them into individual pots.

Hoyas are evergreen climbers, very hardy, easy to grow and will produce pendulous blooms in warmer months. There are over 100 varieties of Hoya. Being epiphytic, Hoyas have small roots, living high in trees feeding from rotting leaf matter just like my one which is attached to a Callistemon. Their small root requirements also make them perfect for pots. They don't mind at all being root bound in a small pot. If planting them in the ground, provide them with a trellis or climbing vessel to happily trail along. My other Hoya is growing happily in pot with a pencil cactus- Euphorbia tirucalli. I water them occasionally and let the plant dry out between watering. They prefer well drained sandy soil and can be grown all year round. I have seen them growing beautifully in hanging baskets too.

Hoyas are unusual in the fact that they flower from the same point every year. I cut my flower from one of these, so it probably won't flower from that point next year. Never mind, I enjoyed wearing it and just looking at its striking form.




