



COMPLETION OF CHISHOLM STREET

The problems regarding Chisholm Street had a long history and were well documented in submissions to Shoalhaven City Council. For many Chisholm Street was regarded as the missing link between Sheaffe Street and Emmett Street. Certainly prior to 1966, according to a local resident, it was nothing more than a bush track. It was eventually sealed, but was only a single lane. This may have been an improvement but did not resolve the open storm water drain down the Eastern side. As Callala Bay grew so did the demand on Chisholm Street. Houses were built on the Western side, as was the Callala Medical Practice, the Callala Public School in Emmett Street and the development

of the Bay Village Shopping Centre, the Callala Community Centre and the Sports Field. These developments have severe impacts on Chisholm Street for both vehicle and pedestrian traffic.

The issues were best described in 2012 when Joe Kowal, a resident in the street wrote to the CBCA advising (sic) "On the evening of Sunday 8th April, 2012 I was witness to an incident in front of my residence.

A young couple with an infant in a pram were walking south towards Sheaffe Street utilising the side of the roadway due to no pedestrian footpath. The evening was dark with minimal illumination.

CALLALA BAY COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION (CBCA) REPORT FOR JULY 2016

Meeting chairman James Morris welcomed Counsellors Patricia White and Greg Watson, and also Mr Tyrone Taylor from the Department of the Prime Minister and Cabinet Indigenous Affairs, Ms Brenda Taylor and Mr Mitchell Pakes. Tyrone was invited to make the acknowledgment to the traditional custodians of this land. Three new members were ratified and welcomed.

Counsellor Watson announced he would be standing for re-election to the council and introduced Mitchell Pakes, as his running mate. He also commented on the damage sustained by Currarong in the recent storm.

SCC Counsellors and senior staff conducted a familiarity tour of the Bay to examine issues raised by the community. These included, drainage problems, road edge erosion and heard a proposal for the construction of stairs and viewing platform at the cliff near the Marine Parade and Bay St intersection. Currently, surfers, divers, and photographers are accessing the rock platform by climbing down the track which, if not remedied, will cause erosion issues to the cliff face. CBCA believe that by providing stairs and platform we can add to our Tourism potential, particularly with the installation of the message poles and information plaques along the Headland Walk. SCC have raised a work order for shoulder grading at the corner of Sealark Rd and Sydney Avenue.

The Chair informed the meeting about the SCC seeking community participation in an innovative feedback process. It is asking members of the community to suggest ways and means of managing the risk of storm damage along the Shoalhaven coastline. Further information and survey data can be found at www.ourcoastourlifestyle.com.au. The Chair encouraged those who could to complete the survey and have their say, especially in light of last weekend's storm.

Tyrone Taylor addressed the meeting regarding the poles/designs by Uncle Noel Wellington that CBCA is keen to purchase and have installed, and which will be accompanied by laser cut stories by Vincenia

High School. Tyrone invited members to contact him if they had any enquiries.

Counsellor White addressed the meeting about the Community Infrastructure Strategic Plan 2016-2030 (Ross Report) which is causing problems because of the incorrect and erroneous information it contains. This was an issue raised by representatives of the Callala Bay Progress Hall, Callala Community Centre and The Callala Brumbies Soccer Club at the recent council tour. Cr White advised the contractor for the waste depots had gone into receivership. None of the local tips will be closed, but will probably operate at more efficient times and on days best suited to residents. SCC is looking to provide one bin per household for sorting at the new \$16M Nowra resources facility, with hopefully 70% of the waste recycled. The current Nowra facility has a life span of ten years which is why alternatives are being sought now.

CBCA will write to Council regarding repairing the basket ball/netball court surfaces; drainage issues Chisholm St; Emmett and Lackersteen Sts.; the drainage between the Community Centre and Soccer fields; and line marking and parking signage in Chisholm St.

CALLALA BUSHCARE GROUP

There has been more seasonal colour in the bush this past month, courtesy of our sensational local Banksias. Along the coastal foreshore, including very harsh and exposed salty locations, the Coastal Banksia (*Banksia integrifolia*), is producing abundant pale yellow flower-cones. This tree, to 6 metres, is a very attractive garden specimen for coastal gardens with its silver- white under leaves. Early European timber getters called it Beefwood because the cut timber resembled a slice of fresh beef with a fatty rind.

In more sheltered woodland areas, winter is also the flowering season for the Hairpin Banksia (*Banksia spinulosa*). This shrub, to 2m high, has narrow toothed leaves and flowering cones which can grow to 16cm long. These range in colour from golden yellow to orange, with hooked styles from red to black. The Hairpin Banksia is another excellent garden specimen.

Banksia flowers produce abundant nectar. This formed the basis of sweet drinks for Aborigines. It also makes the Banksia very popular with nectar-loving insects, birds, and small mammals, such as Antechinus, Eastern Pygmy Possum and Sugar and Feathertail Gliders.

During the month, the Bushcare Group planted more seedlings at our re-vegetation site at Bicentennial Park, and undertook further follow-up weeding in the Bangalay Sand Forest near Benton Sands. Our work is fairly slow at this site, but only because native revegetation is now so successful that we often have to pick our way through dense shrubbery or vine

thickets. It is always a joy to watch the re-growth flourish and to chance upon little bush treasures as they come into flower. This month, despite the cold weather, we are seeing the emergence of some terrestrial orchids, such as the Pixie Caps (*Acianthus fornicatus*) or Lady's Fingers (*Caladenia* spp). Most of terrestrials are deciduous. Their leaves die back in the heat of summer so that the plant is reduced to nothing more than an underground tuber until autumn rains produce new leaves.

Meanwhile at Boorawine Creek, more work has been done to eradicate Paddy's Lucerne from the drain outlet at the end of Regan Close, and to re-vegetate the area with tubestock of *Lomandra*, Nobby's Club Rush and Hopbush provided by Kerry

Thompson from the Bushcare Nursery. Once other weeds (Kikuyu and Arum Lilies) were removed from the drain, it was also possible to use the silt on the new plants, while simultaneously unblocking the drain. An additional serendipity was the felling and mulching of 4 dead gum trees from a nearby nature strip. Happily, one of our members was able to persuade the Council contractors to provide the mulch for use in the Reserve. And so the new plants received a blanket of mulch as well.

CULBURRA BEACH & DISTRICTS GARDEN CLUB ROUNDUP

At our May meeting we elected a new President, Sue Powell who also moonlights as the editor of our garden club newsletter. She welcomed members, visitors and guest speaker Mr Alan Dixon from Clyde River Berry farm. Alan has been growing blueberries for 5 years. His 10 acre orchard is situated between Bateman's Bay and Ulladulla, close to the Clyde river. He also grows hydroponic strawberries, blackberries and raspberries and produces a full range of jams and honey. Alan brought boxes of his blueberry jam for us to purchase - it really is delicious.

According to Alan, we can all grow blueberries. His tips were a well drained acidic soil with high organic matter, a sunny position, protection from wind and birds (you need to net) lots of mulching and pure water. For pots, he recommends using Azalea potting mixtures. Blueberries do not respond to nitrate based fertilisers such as chicken manure or dynamic lifter. Alan uses sawdust mulch, pine needles and coffee grounds which help to produce robust plants. Bushes should not be pruned for the first 3 years but after that you can take 30%—40% of each bush. Varieties suitable for our area are Blue Sharpe, Misty, O'Neal, Brightwell and Premier. Alan kindly donated 4 blueberry bushes towards our raffle.

You can experience the novelty of picking your own berries when his farm is open to the public, 7 days a week 10am—5pm, from December to January.

Theme for the Display table was to bring in a small vase with foliage or flowers. Members had to write how they acquired their vase. It was interesting to find that most came from other countries, one was dug up in a garden, another from a property, others were passed down from family and some were special mementoes.

We meet every 3rd Saturday of the month (except December and January) at the Banksia Senior Citizens Hall, IRT entrance, Culburra Beach at 1.30 pm starting time. Happy gardening and hope to see you at our next meeting.



We understand that picking up dog waste isn't glamorous, but it's part of being a responsible pet owner. It's not just rude leaving this waste around, it's a potential health hazard.

Public Intoxication

The person that invented Beer and Spirits must have been drunk at the time, and I wonder if he or she ever realised what a problem for society Intoxicating Liquor has become. Most of us can get together and have a drink with friends before going home with the wobbly boots and wearing the Beer goggles. However there is always the few that wreck it for the many; people who drink and become so affected by liquor that they either hurt themselves, hurt other persons and or damage property. This is not what the community wants or needs and it is certainly not what Police and other community stake holders want either.

Alcohol related offences occur on a daily basis in our community. Assaults, malicious damage and general street offences occur as a direct result of persons consuming intoxicating liquor. This Calendar year there have been thousands of alcohol related incidents in the Shoalhaven alone. What can be done about it?

In 2011 a report conducted by the NSW Auditor-General stated that alcohol abuse costs NSW taxpayers more than \$1 billion dollars a year, this equates to \$416 per household. (About 9 boxes of beer) A breakdown of those costs is provided below:

- Police \$372.4 million
- Courts \$24.9 million
- Prison \$76.9 million
- Child protection services \$91.1 million
- Out-of-home services \$149.6 million
- Intensive family support \$22.4 million
- Health system \$87.3 million.

What can be done about it?

Well, Police cannot issue a penalty notice to adults for drinking alcohol in an alcohol free zone/prohibited area, it is not an offence. However, your Alcoholic Beverages can be seized and forfeited to the crown. Imagine having your best bottle of Moet being poured down the drain. It hurts to think about it. "Oh the humanity".

You might then say, "Big Deal". Then I will say" Section 632 of the Local Government Act, 1993 reads as follows;

(1) A person who, in a public place within the area of a council, fails to comply with the terms of a notice erected by the council is guilty of an offence.

Maximum penalty: 10 penalty units.

Considering that a penalty unit is \$110 then your decision to drink in an alcohol free zone/prohibited area could potentially cost you a trip to Nowra local Court as well as \$1100. (27 cases of stubbies and 2 large packets of Potato chips). It's your move. Just remember that although it is the Local Government Act, and is enforced by the Local council Rangers, Police are authorised Persons under the act and can also charge you.

We all live in this Community. Let's try and make our community a safer and better place to live by not drinking a skin full every time we go out. Observe the alcohol free zone/prohibited areas. All you good people out there and there are lots, if you see anyone consuming intoxicating liquor in the alcohol free/prohibited areas, being antisocial or well intoxicated, please contact the Police.

Work will include, beach nourishment, surface drainage diversion swale and returfing the disturbed ground once the rock protection has been placed. The area will be closed during site works




Callala Bay Sailing Club Coastal protection Final Design 2016

Tidal beach

Undertake Beach Scraping from low tide compartment to 300mm depth extending around the boat ramp rock revetment flanks to source sand nourishment. Place over the carpark public dinghy launching area.

Coastal Protection

- Install security and public safety measures;
- Remove existing coastal vegetation within protection area;
- Remove timber ramp and side concrete paths;
- Excavate frontage and returns from building foundation depth to -1.0 m AHD at the seaward edge with rock platform expected to be encountered. (Sand to be used as temporary tidal inundation barrier. Topsoil to be stockpiled for remediation works); and
- Supply and place rock armour to Public Work 1:10 design armour for the 20m frontage including the graded sandstone gabion walking layer (see MHL addendum Report).



Remediation

- Cover rock armour / walking layer cover with excavated beach sand to crest level;
- Reinststate concrete paths to 1.8 width from building and replace any reserve link paths; and
- Drainage swales to be shaped to discharge overland flow to the boat ramp carpark topsoil with kikuyu turf to building sides.



Completion of chisholm street continued

A vehicle approached the oncoming family from the corner of Sheaffe Street onto Chisholm Street. The woman pushing the pram automatically moved to the right, off the roadway, which resulted in her and the infant in the pram to overbalance towards the open drain culvert (approximate depth 500mm below road level). If it was not for the quick action of her husband, grabbing his wife who was desperately hanging on to the pram, both she and the infant in the pram (which was at the point of fully overturning) could have suffered serious injuries.”

Joe goes on to describe the deficiencies of the road, narrow width, open drains, lack of footpath etc. But this was not an isolated incident. Anecdotal reports detail many near misses. Despite requests from various CBCA committees who asked Council to widen the roadway and construct a footpath on the Western Side, nothing was resolved, in fact there was an impasse between CBCA requests and Councils proposed solution. In 2015 the CBCA Committee, took another look at the problem. A team headed by Howard Duncan, Jim Townsend, Joe Kowal and Duncan Marshall, arrived at a potential resolution of the sticking issue. Jim and Joe drew preliminary plans, Duncan, our master wordsmith, did the research and prepared a factual submission to Council. Counsellor Jemma Tribe became our champion in council and organised an onsite meeting with Council, senior staffers including Mr Benjamin Stewart, Director of Assets and Works. After some discussion- illustrated by some actual traffic incidents- a compromise was reached. A further discussion took place in Council Chambers and a final agreement on the design of Chisholm Street was achieved. The result was that construction of Chisholm Street commenced in early 2016 and was completed in May/June 2016.

We believe that our common sense approach and our willingness to compromise and work with Council has led to very satisfactory conclusion. A wide roadway, with a footpath on the logical

(Western) side, resolution of the open drain issues and resolution of the dangerous Emmett/Chisholm Streets corner. We express our thanks to Mayor Gash, Benjamin Stewart, Counsellor Patricia White and of course we salute our champion Counsellor Jemma Tribe.

As we go through life we have many choices to make. Some are good and some are not. In Genesis 13:5-18 Lot and Abram had many quarrels and ended going their different ways.

Adrian is a kind of person you love to hate. He is always in a good mood and always has something positive to say. When someone ask him how things were he reply "I could not be better". He was a natural motivator. If a friend was having a bad day, Adrian was there telling them to look on the positive side of things. His attitude made me curious, so I asked Adrian "I don't understand, you can't be positive all the time. How do you do it?" Adrian replied "Each morning I wake up and say to myself, you have two choices today. You can choose to be in a good mood or you can choose to be in a bad mood. Each time something bad happens I can choose to be a victim or I can choose to learn from it. Every time someone comes to me complaining, I can choose to accept their complaining or I can point out the positive side. I protested it is not that easy. "Yes it is," Adrian replied "Life is all about choices. When you cut away the junk, every situation is a choice. You choose how to react to the situation and how people affect your mood. You choose to be in a good mood or not".

The bottom line is, it's your choice. I reflected what Adrian said. We lost touch over the years, but I often thought about him especially when I had to make a choice. Then a few years later, I heard Adrian was involved in a serious accident, falling 60 feet. After 18 hours of surgery and weeks of intensive care Adrian was released from the hospital. When I asked Adrian how he was he replied, "I couldn't be any better. "Wanna see my scars?" I declined, but did ask him what had gone through his mind. He replied "as I lay on the ground I remembered that I had two choices.

I could choose to live or I could choose to die. I choose to live". "Weren't you scared I asked.

Adrian continued "the paramedics were great. They kept telling me I was going to be fine. But when they wheeled me into the emergency department, I saw the expressions on the faces of the doctors and nurses I got really scared. In their eyes I read - he's a dead man. I knew I had to take action". What did you do?" I asked. "Well, there was a big burly nurse shouting question at me she asked if I was allergic to anything. Yes!" The doctors and nurses stopped working and t waited for my reply. I yelled "Gravity". Over their laughter I told them "I am choosing to live. Operate on me as if I am alive, not dead." Adrian lived, thanks to the skills of his doctors but also because of his amazing attitude.

I learnt from him that every day we have the choice to live fully. Attitude, after all is everything. "Therefore don't worry about tomorrow for tomorrow will worry about itself. Each day has enough trouble of its own.

After all, today is the tomorrow you worried about yesterday. Enjoy each day each breath, and each other.





PUPPY FARMS

Where does that puppy come from?

When people buy a new puppy or kitten they are often swept up in the excitement of seeing that cute little ball of fluff and do not investigate fully where the puppy has come from and what its state of health is. Many pups and kittens have been bred by caring breeders and have been taken to a Veterinary Surgeon to have a health check and their vaccinations and microchipping. However many also get pets that have been bred on puppy farms and a lot of these puppies are not checked or vaccinated by a vet and many of them have health problems.

What exactly is a puppy farm? Puppy farms are basically pet production factories where large numbers of breeding dogs and or cats are kept, usually in small cages, and bred as frequently to produce the maximum numbers of offspring. When their breeding performance decreases they are usually put down and replaced with a younger breeder. No real records of breeding lines are kept and often the puppies and kittens are very inbred. The facilities usually have poor hygiene practices. The puppies or kittens are usually not checked or vaccinated by a veterinary surgeon. I recent months I have seen a number of pets coming in for their second vaccinations where problems that the purchaser should have been aware of before purchasing their pet were not detected until the owners had formed an emotional attachment to their new pet.

Many puppy farms set up on a leased property and operate until the complaints start coming in and then relocate before they can be raided by relevant authorities. Common problems that I have seen include Feline respiratory tract viral and Chlamydia infections, kennel cough (Canine cough) infections, heart problems, un-descended testicles, umbilical hernias, jaw malformations, entropion and dislocating patella's to name a few. All of these can be expensive to treat and in some cases can cause problems for the life of the pet.

RSPCA NSW has advised a Parliamentary Inquiry to create a breeder licensing system in an effort to control the puppy farm situation across the state. This would allow inspections to occur to ensure the facilities were of a suitable standard and also allow some control of the number of litters that could be bred from an individual.

They also said it is important that consumers are educated to stop the demand for pets from these properties because it is the demand for these mass bred designer pets that allows the people who set up these farms to make large profits.

Next time you purchase a pet try to find out a bit about it, if possible see the parents of the pup or kitten, ensure that its vaccinations have been carried out by a veterinary surgeon who has also given it a health check. With modern printers puppy farms can produce quite convincing vaccination certificates so check that any certificate is signed by a Veterinary Surgeon who has put their registration number on the certificate. Check that the microchip in the puppy is the one on its paperwork, and check the pup over for any obvious defects or problems such as coughing, hernias, inflamed runny eyes or jaws that look funny. If in doubt get a vet check or contact the veterinary surgeon who did the vaccination before you part with your money and get attached to your new pet.
