



CBCA REPORT

Membership for Bert and Kym Haak was ratified at the July CBCA General Meeting. Membership continues to grow and the meeting was advised Committee Members had met with Michael Strachan from Shoalhaven City Council(SCC) to discuss proposed improvements to the Callala Bay Boat Ramp and Jetty extension. This involves widening the boat ramp and putting in a dividing walk way between the two ramps. Extending the toe of the

boat ramp was discussed, but was considered to be infeasible. We also discussed pontoon type installations but these were ruled out due to wind and tidal issues. In the most recent advice from the SCC, the ramp is listed as a priority one in round two of the Better Boating Fund for 2017. We will advise further when we know the result of the submission.

After many submissions by the CBCA, we have received advice from Shoalhaven Water that a water station will be installed in the sporting complex to service the skate board park, basketball courts and soccer fields as well as the community generally. This location is used extensively by many members of the community.

Members of the Committee met with a SCC representative to discuss remediation of the Sealark Road, Sydney Avenue, Derwent Street and Monarch Place, intersections. The CBCA expressed concern over SCC's proposed solution in that it did not address or resolve safety issue. Several alternative proposals were presented and taken under advisement by Council. We hope to reach a compromise – as we did in Chisholm St- which resolves our issues and is capable of being funded by Council.

The official handover of the Indigenous Poles will be held **September 22**nd **2017** on the Callala Bay headland at *10.45 am for commencement of the ceremony at 11.00 am*. Light refreshments will be provided. While invitations will be issued to respective guests we do take this opportunity to invite ALL of Callala to the function. We would love to see you there.

We will be holding a fund-raiser on the October Long Weekend (1st) outside IGA and will be offering sausage sandwiches and steak sandwiches. All funds will go towards community projects.

The next General Meeting will be Wednesday 13th September at 7.00 pm for a 7.30 pm start. Come along and join us for tea and coffee. You don't have to be member to make your opinions heard.

- Use a nicotine replacement patch to lessen the desire to smoke
- Use a fast acting nicotine replacement option such as gum, lozenges, spray or nicotine inhaler to assist with those weak moments.
- Keep yourself busy busy people find it hard to find time to smoke .
- Keep away from triggers such as smoking with the morning coffee – swap the coffee for a juice in the morning.
- Put away the money you would otherwise spend on tobacco, you will save up a treat for yourself before you know it.

POLICE REPORT

On the Beat.

Back in the olden days it seemed a lot easier to get a drivers licence. All you needed was a horse a cart and a couple of shillings. Nowadays it is a bit harder because vehicles are faster, stronger and can easily kill people if the driver, amongst other reasons does not concentrate or is inexperienced. To get driving experience most people have to drive on the road, a bit of a catch 22 situation.

This is why we have the "L" Plates and "P" Plates.

From **November, 2017** there will be changes in the system for "L" and "P" Plate licence holders so if this is you, get onto the internet and have a look on the appropriate web site.

If you are a "P" Plate Licence holder, an easy way to lose your licence is to continually fail to display your "P" Plates. It's not hard to get a suitable holder to display your "P" Plates. Once installed in a correct position you don't have to worry about the 2 points off your licence and the \$257 fine ever again. The ROAD TRANSPORT (DRIVER LICENSING) REGULATION 2008 states;

"P1" the holder must not drive any motor vehicle unless a sign, issued or authorised by the Authority and displaying the letter "P" in red on a white background, is displayed:

"P2", the holder must not drive any motor vehicle unless a sign, issued or authorised by the Authority and displaying the letter "P" in green on a white background is displayed

• in the case of a vehicle not towing a trailer-on the exterior of the vehicle in a conspicuous position at the front and the rear of the vehicle, or a conspicuous position on the roof of the vehicle. • and in the case of a vehicle towing a traileron the exterior of the vehicle and trailer in a conspicuous position at the front of the vehicle and the rear of the trailer, or a conspicuous position on the roof of the vehicle, and in such a manner as to be clearly visible and not to in any way obscure the letter "P" on the sign when viewed from ahead of or behind the vehicle.

Failing to comply with these regulations may well end up a very costly exercise for you.

Also remember that you can *Dob in a Druggie* any time you like by contacting Nowra Police or ringing Crime Stoppers.



GARDEN CLUB

ne of our most popular guest speakers is Peter Phelps from Flamingo Florist in Nowra.

Walking in with a large box of foliage and flowers, we knew we were in for another interesting afternoon. Jacinta Price, one of his assistants, also came along to show us how they construct laurel wreaths for Anzac ceremonies. Peter pointed out that most of the foliage and flowers that he was using were imported.

We were surprised to see Monstera Deliciosa leaves amongst them as they are common in gardens. Peter explained that every leaf must be perfect, no snail holes, cuts or burnt bits so at the end of the day there is no wastage with foliage or flowers and everything can be used.

Peter obviously enjoys working with foliage as he set to create a large arrangement, fit for a 5star hotel lobby. It featured leaves from Asplenium or Bird's Nest, palm trees, Gymea lily, Cycad, Heleconia, Devil's ivy, Magnolia, Leatherleaf fern, Cordyline and Happy plant. For colour, he added Singapore orchids, Anthuriums and Oncydium orchids which looked amazing.

While Peter was working on his arrangement, our eyes kept darting over to Jacinta. After sorting each laurel leaf, it took her over an hour to overlap and attach every leaf meticulously with large pins.

Most of us had no idea how much work goes into these wreaths. She completed the wreath by adding 3 poppies to represent the 3 services and purple ribbon. Being a very generous man, Peter gave us the arrangement for the raffle and member Dawn Neville was the lucky winner. (it took a few goes to get it in her car!)

*A tip from Peter when making an arrangementsmake each stem neat and minimum for container as clean edges leave more room in the oasis. (Peter used a knife for trimming.)

If you are using foliage make sure the container is big enough to hold lots of water.

Some of the leaves that Peter used in his arrangement came from the Gymea Lily. The Gymea lily Doryanthes excelsa is an iconic plant of the Australian bush. The botanic name, 'Doryanthes', derives from two Greek words - 'dory', meaning spear, and 'anthos', meaning flower and this refers to the beacon like flower heads that stand out in the bush.

With their clumps of luxurious green leaves and big spectacular red flower heads, they make a fabulous feature in the garden. It's a tough native plant which can be grown in any position in the garden or in a large pot and is very tolerant of dry conditions.

They prefer a well- drained soil and fed regularly with a slow release fertiliser. Plants can be grown from seed but they are slow growing and take years to flower.

We meet every 3rd Saturday of the month at the Banksia Senior Citizens Hall, IRT entrance, Culburra Beach at 1.30 pm starting time. Happy gardening!

ANGLICAN CHURCH

Sixteen hundred years ago in a garden in Milan a young man from north Africa became a Christian believer.

He had been searching for something for many years and had tried quite a few of the spiritual disciplines and therapies on offer at that time. He had had a girlfriend but that came to nothing. He later found out she had been pregnant and he had a son.

He also had a ferocious mother who constantly argued with him for his lack of his initiative or strength of character. He managed to find a good job in a university, but his underlying depression weighted him down.

As he sat in the garden with tears running down his face he heard singing – a song, a voice of a child next door, repeating the Latin word *Tolle lege* - take and read.

In the end, he took hold of a copy of the Bible and read, "Arm yourself with the Lord Jesus Christ and spend no more though on nature and nature's appetites." That conversation was a turning point in history, for the young man was **Augustine** a great philosopher of the western world.

I was thinking about this as I sat in garden in the warm winter sun, read my Bible – Marks Gospel.

I remembered all the books I had to read for my theology degree, some I understood straight away, some was like ploughing through treacle.

But **Augustine's** words kept resonating in my mind, "take and read" I remember following the words with my finger, and saying the sentences out loud until I began to grasp something of what was being read.

Without books, without reading, our understanding in uninformed, our judgments narrow. We are open to manipulation by those who would steel our freedom.

I suspect that the neglect of reading has to do with the wider kind of spiritual thuggery that is tearing us apart and robbing us of belief, both in God and in ourselves.

Augustine found his true self through a child's singing and a challenging text. He met the living God on the page of a book and it broke his heart and set him free.

I found my true self after hours and hours of studying and trusting in God to lead me through.

We must not deny our self's or our children what God desires and what God gives so freely and that is spiritual freedom, if we take time to read scripture - read mark and inwardly digest.

To read, mark, learn, and inwardly digest is probably a very familiar phrase to many Anglicans.

How to stay informed and updated

 Before this fire season starts, it is important to know how to access updates and information regarding bush fires in your local area. There are a number of resources. You can download the 'Fires Near Me' app; follow NSW RFS on Facebook and Twitter; follow local and state media sites or access www. rfs.nsw.gov.au.

Bush Fire Neighbourhood Safer Place

Continuing on from above a **Bush Fire Neighbourhood Safer Place** has been set up at Parkes Crescent Park (*playground near the shops*) at Callala Beach. Neighbourhood Safer Places are a place of **LAST RESORT** during a bush fire emergency.

Leaving early is still your best and safest option when a bush fire is near. The **Safer Place** is to be used only when all other options in your bush fire survival plan can't be put into action safely.

You should also know how to get there, as well as alternate routes in case the road is blocked or too dangerous to drive on.

Remember now is the time to prepare your home and family, not when there is an active bush fire in your local area. Being prepared and having a plan will help to keep you and your family safe.

VET'S ADVICE

ALLERGIC DERMATITIS

One of the common problems we see in veterinary medicine is itchy pets. Many of those itches are caused by allergy, and the arrival of spring also means the start of allergy season for many pets.

Broadly, allergies can be divided into 4 groups:

- environmental (called atopy)
- contact
- insect or parasitic
- food

Atopic dermatitis is a major cause of chronic itching in dogs. It is caused by an allergic reaction to substance (allergen) in the environment. Many allergens are airborne, so pets can have almost constant exposure. Some allergens, like dust mites, are found year round, but others, such as pollen, are more prevalent in spring and summer.

The easiest way to think of atopic dermatitis is hay fever in the skin. The higher the allergen load, the itchier the animal. Like hay fever, atopic dermatitis can be managed, but when the pet is exposed to the allergens again, the itching will return. This makes the disease very frustrating to treat (for owners and vets!). Unlike people, dogs do not tend to out grow their allergies, which means that treatment may be life long, albeit often seasonal.

Treatment is varied depending on the individual animal. It may involve some type of anti inflammatory and anti itch medication or immune modifying drugs. Antibiotics or anti fungal medication may be prescribed, as secondary infections are common. Many dogs will also have ear infections as a result of atopy and these will need treatment.

It is possible to desensitise animals that suffer from atopy. This involves a referral to a specialist veterinary dermatologist who can perform skin tests to determine what the allergy is, then manufacture specific injections to desensitise the immune system.

Contact allergies are less common. These occur when an animal comes into direct contact with the allergen, for example a specific plant or a common household chemical. Diagnosis of this will involve very good observation from the owner to determine the itch pattern (I recommend keeping a diary of itchy days). Once determined, it may be possible to eliminate the cause.

Insect and parasitic causes of allergy include fleas, sand flies and mosquitoes. All animals will feel an itch when bitten by these pests, but some animals are truly allergic to the bites and will develop extreme itching. These causes are easy to eliminate with good flea and insect control and limiting access to outside during mosquito season.

Food allergies are common and may occur at any time of the year. The way to test for a food allergy is an elimination diet. This means feeding your pet a previously unfed protein and carbohydrate source or a specifically designed commercial diet. The new diet needs to be fed exclusively for 6-8 weeks. Elimination diets are best done under veterinary advice so that we can determine the best option for your pet.

If you suspect your pet has allergies, please arrange a consultation with your vet. We can make their spring a far more comfortable time

VP (Victory in the Pacific) Day, also referred to as VJ (Victory over Japan) Day - is celebrated on 15 August.
