CBCA Update

Our membership continues to grow; this month we welcomed Tony and Doris Muir as our latest members. Like all voluntary organisations we are always looking for new people and a membership application form is included in the issue. Membership is \$5.00 pa per couple and entitles you to receive a monthly copy of the newsletter either home delivered or by email. You also receive updates on Council matters. We meet on the second Wednesday of the month at 7.00 pm in the Callala Community Centre.

The Labor candidate for Gilmore, Ms Fiona Phillips, was a guest at our May meeting. Fiona spoke of her local connections to Gilmore and her life and career.

Councillor Patricia White updated us on several matters including SCC's opposition to the removal of trees by Endeavour Energy and asked that all members of the community report any tree removal to report the matter to Council. In response to questions she also spoke about the current plans for waste management. In particular, the imminent signing of contracts for the new waste treatment plant which will extend the life of the current landfill tip by 30 years and the potential savings in payments to State Government. When operational the general public will be able to view the plant.

Our Path Enhancement program is ongoing. This month we installed two seats in the playground reserve next to the boat ramp; excavated and prepared sites on the headland to replace two wooden benches in need of repair, and an additional seat, picnic table and a unique carved wooden bench, as well as two sites for placement of addition Indigenous Carved poles by Jerrinja artist Uncle Noel Wellington. We are waiting for approval to install two seats on the foreshore between the Boat ramp and Sailing School. A Native Title check (NTC) has been approved to allow installation of an additional picnic table

and seats in the reserve north of Sheaffe St and we will be installing another picnic table and seat in the reserve between Sheaffe and Watts Sts. If you would like to assist, please call us 4446 6535. Our thanks go to Jim Townsend, Howard Duncan, James Morris, Vanessa Middleton and Tony Muir for their time.

CBCA has raised with Council the construction of a kerb and gutter in Lackersteen St, which appears to be out of alignment, poses a potential threat to traffic flow and may represent a "choke point" for two-way traffic. Duncan Marshall has raised the concern and we will continue to discuss the matter to try and resolve the issue.

The State Government has allowed the Sealark Rd Development to proceed to a gateway determination (see this newsletter for details). We will continue to monitor this application to rezone the site. We do not anticipate any further reports for at least 12 months as the developers have to advise how they propose to meet the guidelines imposed.

James Morris and Howard Duncan attended the recent CCB Executive Meeting and represented the CBCA. Council have installed two information signs on the Bicentennial Park section of the path describing the significance of the Indigenous Midden and the importance of the headland to the Jerrinja. CBCA first put this idea to Council a little over two years ago. Entries for the 2019 Callala Community Directory have now closed, the new edition will be available shortly.

Callala Medical Report



Over the last few years working in the area, I have seen a few cases of Q fever, and anyone who has had it before will tell you it is not a very nice infection to have. Q fever is a disease caused by bacteria that is spread to humans from animals. It can cause flu-like symptoms that can be severe. Some people experience long-term health issues following infection such as infections around the heart. Kangaroos and cattle are animals which can carry the Q fever bacteria. People whose work puts them in contact with high-risk animals or animal products have a high risk of getting infected with Q fever - such as cattle farmers, vets or people who mow lawn with Kangaroo droppings on it. There is a vaccine available, and it is strongly recommended for people aged 15 years and over who work in high-risk occupations. If you are interested in finding out more, please speak to your GP or your friendly team at Callala Medical Centre.

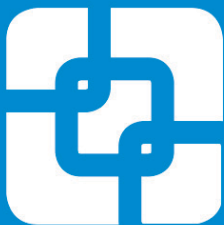

South Coast Vet Report

Delta therapy dogs have been scientifically proven to physically benefit hospitalised patients by reducing blood pressure and cholesterol levels, decreasing the risk of cardiovascular disease, providing tactile stimulation, assisting in pain management and motivating patients to move, walk and stimulate their senses.

Emotionally having a visit from Chit Chat improves self-esteem, acceptance from others, has a calming effect and lifts the mood of the patient, often provoking laughter. Therapy pets reduce the feeling on loneliness by encouraging conversation and remind the patient of good times at home with their pets. Being with a pet increases levels of serotonin, the 'feel good' hormone that relieves stress and helps calm anxiety. Therapy pets make the patient feel loved and needed and enhancing mental health.

A dog in the hospital decreases the unfriendly, sterile feeling and lifts everyone's' mood and this continues after the visit.

Keep up the good work Chit Chat.

Ascension Day and Pentecost.

The major Christian feast of Ascension is marked 40 days after Easter. On this day Christians celebrate the Ascension of Jesus Christ on Heaven. The Messiah remained on earth 40 days and communicated with his apostles and was seen by over 500 people.

Pentecost, also known as Whit Sunday, is a religious holiday that celebrates the coming of the Holy Spirit on the early followers of Jesus Christ and also recognizes the day that the church was established.

Pentecost is the Jewish Festival of Weeks, which can be found in the Hebrew Bible. Shavuot called the Festival of Weeks and is also called the Festival of Reaping or harvest. Jews traditionally read the Book of Ruth at Pentecost as the story links with the grain harvest theme of the festival. Pentecost 2019, as a Christian feast, dates back to the first century. It occurs 50 days after Easter Sunday and falls on the ancient Jewish festival called the "feast of weeks".

In the New Testament, Pentecost was the occasion of the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and other followers of Jesus Christ and therefore became a feast commemorating this occasion. The English word "Pentecost" is a translation of the Greek word pentekostos, which means "fifty".

It comes from the ancient Christian expression pentekoste hemera, which means fiftieth day (therefore applicable to the 50 days after the Resurrection of Christ). But Christians did not invent the phrase "fiftieth day". Rather, they borrowed it from Greek-speaking Jews who used the phrase to refer to a Jewish holiday.

Across denominational lines, Pentecost has been an opportunity for Christians to honour the role of the Holy Spirit in their lives, and celebrate the birth of the church. The traditions differ between church dominations, with some celebrating the holiday more significantly than others.

Some churches decorate their churches with the colour red to represent the "power and fire of the Spirit". Churches often welcome new members or confirm existing members on Pentecost through baptisms and confirmations, and somewhat explains why some refer to the day as "White Sunday" in reference to the white clothing commonly worn for baptism. Additionally there are religious (church) services, Festive meals, Processions and Ordinations.

We read in Acts 2 :1-5 of that fulfilment. “And suddenly there came from heaven a sound like a mighty rushing wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. And divided tongues as of fire appeared to them and rested on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit gave them utterance.”

Some people dismissed the whole affair as drunken revelry, but Peter brought them down to earth. Apart from the fact it was the wrong time of day for drunkenness he told the crowd that they ought to recognise that this had been foretold by the prophets.

Some of the things we say about the wind today may help us to understand more about the way the Spirit of God affects us. We talk about an idea or a person coming like a breath of fresh air. Blowing away the cobwebs, clearing the air. God’s Spirit can set us free from habits and ways of thinking that can keep us stuck and prevent us from seeing straight.

When Jesus said that the Spirit would come and lead us to truth (John 16:13) he was not just talking about the Spirit sorting out our muddled thinking. He was saying that there is real hard work to be done. Being a Christian is about being reconciled to God, through the death and resurrection of Jesus and knowing the connection to God through Jesus and through the gift of the Holy Spirit – this powerful , energy giving life-giver.

The new Resource Recovery Facility (RRF) will be constructed on Council owned land adjacent to the current West Nowra Landfill site. Works will commence in 2019 and the facility is expected to be fully operational by late 2021.

At the October 2018 Ordinary Meeting, Council resolved unanimously to adopt this new technology which Shoalhaven City Council, Mayor Amanda Findley stated will be an Australian first in waste management.

“The Shoalhaven, much like other council areas are running out of landfill space and in 12 years time, it is predicted we will reach capacity at our West Nowra Landfill Facility,” Clr Findley said.

“This new facility will be a giant leap forward for how Shoalhaven manages waste that would otherwise end up in the landfill.

“This state-of-the-art facility will be Australia’s first Advanced Treatment plant capable of diverting 90 per cent of mixed waste from the landfill. Everything that can be reused or recycled will be extracted in one process.

“For Shoalhaven residents, this will mean no change in the way that they manage their own household waste.

“The introduction of this new facility is projected to extend the landfill life of the Shoalhaven to more than 50 years.”

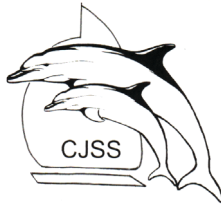

Guest speaker for the May meeting was Marieanne Faull from Shoalhaven Family History Society. Marieanne is a family historian, genealogist and secretary for the society. Her task involves helping people to trace their ancestors and research family lines back to a specific time period or individual. Marieanne told us about a client who asked the society to trace her family tree and what evolved were two books of information regarding her family. Marianne tracked through Australian records first before moving to information from overseas. What Marieanne discovered was an incredible journey for this client. Hopefully it will inspire us to look at our family tree and maybe fill in the blanks. Thank you Marieanne for a very interesting talk.

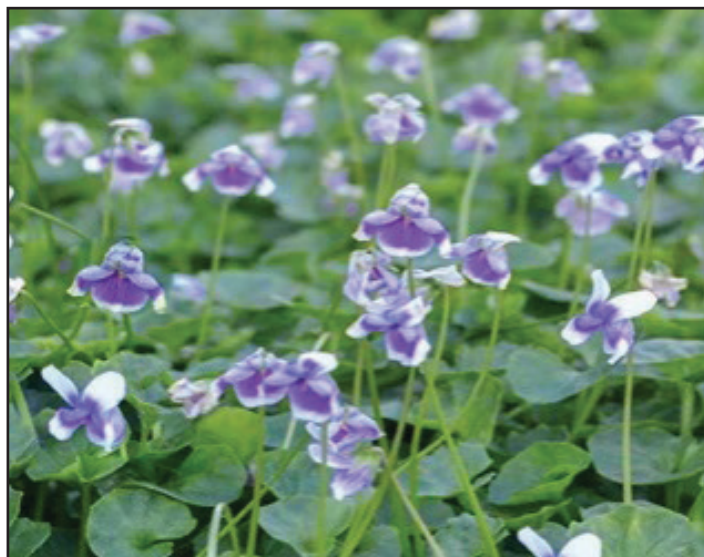
The weather is getting cooler and it's so good being in the garden. I have started to trim most of my perennials and pulled out annuals that have now gone to seed. This is your last chance to plant spring bulbs and start collecting fallen autumn leaves for your compost. In most gardens, there is always a section where nothing will grow because it's either too shady and damp or too dry. You can usually fix this problem by planting ground covers like the following-

Native violet is your go-to plant for that shady, often damp area down the side of the house where it can spread easily. It's ideal to soften around a stepping-stone path, adding mauve and white flowers for most of the year to the dense cover of round leaves.

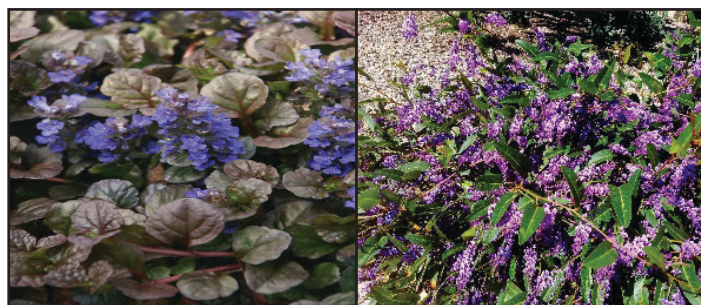
Ajuga (Perennial bugleweed) is a member of the mint family. This creeping evergreen plant quickly fills in empty areas, smothering out weeds while adding exceptional foliage colour and blooms. The flowers of bugleweed are normally bluish to

purple or white and it grows in sun or shade.

A popular native ground cover is Hardenbergia violacea- a tough and easy-care ground covering plants with purple flowers. It blooms from spring through to summer and it's good for the soil. It smothers weeds, is drought tolerant and can be grown in light clay to sandy soils and prefers sun to part shade.

Gateway Determination

Planning proposal (Department Ref: PP_2019_SHOAL_001_00): to rezone part of Lot 5 DP 1225356 Sealark Road Callala Bay from E3 Environmental Management Zone to R2 Low Density Residential and/or R3 Medium Density Residential Zones, RE1 Public Recreation and/or RE2 Private Recreation Zone and to amend development controls.

I, the Director Regions, Southern at the Department of Planning and Environment, as delegate of the Minister for Planning, have determined under section 3.34(2) of the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979* (the Act) that an amendment to the Shoalhaven Local Environmental Plan (LEP) 2014 as described above should proceed subject to the following conditions:

1. The studies and investigations as identified in Shoalhaven City Council's covering letter dated 14 March 2019 and Office of Environment and Heritage advice to Council on the planning proposal dated 31 January 2019 are to be prepared prior to public consultation.
2. The planning proposal is to be revised, prior to public consultation to:
 - (a) Provide an assessment of the consistency of the planning proposal with the Illawarra Shoalhaven Regional Plan.
 - (b) Demonstrate compliance with Section 9.1 Directions 1.4 Oyster Aquaculture, 2.1 Environmental Protection Zones, 2.2 Coastal Management, 2.3 Heritage Conservation, 4.3 Flood Prone Land, 4.4 Planning for Bushfire Protection, 5.10 Implementation of Regional Plans, 6.2 Reserving land for Public Purposes.
 - (c) Provide an assessment of current SEPPs including the SEPP (Coastal Management) 2018.
 - (d) Clarify the proposed zonings and development controls in the explanation of the provisions and proposed maps.
3. Details of a suitable mechanism, such as a Voluntary Planning Agreement, for any proposed dedication of lands to the state of NSW for extension to the Jervis Bay National Park or other public open space are to be provided prior to public consultation.
4. The studies and investigations and a revised planning proposal are required to be submitted to the Department for consideration prior to public consultation.
5. Public exhibition is required under section 3.34(2)(c) and schedule 1 clause 4 of the Act as follows:
 - (a) the planning proposal must be made publicly available for a minimum of **28 days**; and
 - (b) the planning proposal authority must comply with the notice requirements for public exhibition of planning proposals and the specifications for

material that must be made publicly available along with planning proposals as identified in section 5.5.2 of *A guide to preparing local environmental plans* (Department of Planning and Environment 2016).

6. Consultation is required with the following public authorities/organisations under section 3.34(2)(d) of the Act and/or to comply with the requirements of relevant section 9.1 Directions:
- NSW Rural Fire Service (S 9.1 Direction 4.4 Planning for Bushfire Protection)
 - NSW Office of Environment and Heritage
 - Department of Primary Industries (S 9.1 Direction 1.4 Oyster Aquaculture)
 - Shoalhaven Water
 - The Jerringa Local Aboriginal Land Council

Each public authority/organisation is to be provided with a copy of the planning proposal and any relevant supporting material and given at least 21 days to comment on the proposal.

7. An infrastructure delivery plan to determine infrastructure and servicing requirements for the site is to be prepared prior to finalisation of the plan.
8. A public hearing is not required to be held into the matter by any person or body under section 3.34(2)(e) of the Act. This does not discharge Council from any obligation it may otherwise have to conduct a public hearing (for example, in response to a submission or if reclassifying land).
9. The planning proposal authority is authorised as the local plan-making authority to exercise the functions under section 3.36(2) of the Act subject to the following:
- (a) the planning proposal authority has satisfied all the conditions of the Gateway determination;
 - (b) the planning proposal is consistent with section 9.1 Directions or the Secretary has agreed that any inconsistencies are justified; and
 - (c) there are no outstanding written objections from public authorities.
10. The time frame for completing the LEP is to be **24 months** following the date of the Gateway determination.

CBCA Response - Sealark

The Callala Bay Community Association Inc (CBCA) in response to the SCC Notification makes the following comments for consideration.

1. The CBCA only received advice from Council on 17th Jan 2019 and note the deadline for response is 5.00pm 31/01/19. The CBCA does not meet in January, our next meeting is 13th Feb and we have not had an opportunity to present this to the Callala Community. We initially request the deadline for comment be extended to 31/03/19 or later to allow us to present the submission to our members and obtain a community response.

2. We have copied an email below from Mr Duncan Marshall and we endorse and support his observations and ask that Council take these into consideration.

3. We have some concerns regarding the environmental impact of this proposal if it were to proceed.

- Run off into Wowly Creek. Wowly Creek is a sensitive habitat for breeding native fish species and shell fish. It is currently protected and comes under the jurisdiction of Jervis Bay Marine Park. SCC in rejecting a development in Culburra argued that run off in the proposed area would severely impact Lake Wollumboola. Given the proximity of the proposed development in Sealark, Council should apply the same criteria for consistency.

- Wowly Creek, is tidal and only opened during periods of high tides. Run off would only increase siltation and further increase the potential for algae. The creek is a popular swimming spot for families with children and already with the influx of tourists contributes to the community economy.

- Car Parking During the peak season car parking is already at a premium- often cars parking in the bushland verges this proposal would seek to make parking more difficult (Hyams Beach?) We note the improved parking

issue is contemplated in the PRM proposal, but make the observation that parking should not be a trade off for environmental concerns, particularly if the pollution issues would make Wowly Creek an unacceptable swimming area.

- Net Benefits; Without substantial improvements, road widening curb and guttering there will be no benefits with regard to improved local traffic flow. There is already a proposal for an additional 300 plus houses on the Halloran Trust owned land, again the argument that housing should be 'traded' off against environmental issues is rejected.

- As indicated in Mr Marshalls letter the developers had ample opportunity when they submitted their original development to consider this land and did not do so. They cannot now come back and expect to have a second bite of the cherry.
