A Brief History of Callala Beach RSL Sub-Branch

The Callala Beach RSL Sub-Branch has just celebrated its 40th Anniversary (*in 2017*) and in that time has achieved their original goal "to build a club".

This article tells the story of how the conception of the RSL Country Club originated:

- **1976 October-November** – Mr Les Ridge, and RSL Central Southern District Councillor Mr Alex Leach canvassed the community to hold a meeting to form a Callala Beach RSL Sub-Branch.
- **1977 March** – the inaugural meeting of the Callala Beach RSL Sub-Branch and Youth Club was held and a committee formed.
- **1977 April** - a Notice of Motion was passed that the Sub-Branch's main aim was to purchase land for a building and provide recreation for the local community.
- **1977 June** - a meeting was held with Mr Warren Halloran, at Les Ridges' home in Callala Beach. Present were: Les Ridge, Secretary Gordon Ravell and Treasurer Bob Irwin. It was agreed in principle for the Sub-Branch to purchase 3-5 acres of land, now known as Benton Sands, with a handshake with Mr Warren Halloran to purchase by June 1978. However, this did not eventuate because the foreshore was resumed by council, so the Sub-Branch was offered 196 acres in their present location.
- **1977 July** – the RSL NSW State President and Secretary visited Callala Beach to view the proposed site for purchase and gave the approval for a loan of \$10,000 plus a bridging load of \$3,500. This was to be paid back by 31st January 1979 which left the Sub-Branch \$1,500 to pay - to purchase the land. Mr Alf Irwin of Callala Beach offered the use of his garage as a temporary meeting place for the Sub-Branch.

Meanwhile, a big **THANK YOU** to the Callala Beach RSL Women's Auxiliary, the Sub-Branch and community for their huge effort in helping repay the loans. The first Board of Directors was formed and obtained a liquor licence.

The Sub-Branch went on to finance the construction of the club.

- **1983** – Callala Beach RSL Sub-Branch leased the building and land to the Callala RSL Country Club, which survived on voluntary labour for many years from the community.
- **2017 December** – The Lease is still in place today with amenities such as bowling greens, golf course and fishing clubs.

The beautiful summer holidays are upon us, and with it, I get to meet many travellers from all corners of Australia and the world.

Unfortunately when I get to meet new travellers, it usually means they have hurt themselves in the great outdoors; and I want to take this opportunity to remind everyone, that if they do hurt themselves and are exposed to soil, then it is important that they are up to date with their immunization for the tetanus infection. The tetanus immunization can come in two forms:

- the ADT is required every 10 years, or
- Boostrix which most new parents or grandparents would be immunized with, before meeting their newborn.

When travellers come and visit me, it is also vitally important for me to be aware of their medical history, medication list, immunizations and allergy list.

For this reason, I strongly recommend everyone (*especially my patients who migrate north for winter*) to update their "My Health Record" through their GP, which will allow other medical practitioners to update and access their medical summary.

Register your Four Legged Friend

Have you registered your cat or dog on the NSW Pet Registry? If you change address, re-home your pet, or if your pet has died - it is a requirement of the NSW Companion Animals Act, that all dogs and cats over six months of age must be registered and their records kept up-to-date.

In February, Shoalhaven City Council will be issuing a notice to register to local pet owners who have a dog or cat that is older than six months of age and not lifetime registered.

Registering your pet can be easily completed online at www.petregistry.nsw.gov.au. You can claim an existing pet, update your address and contact details, change ownership of your pet and pay lifetime registration fees online

GARDEN CLUB

I love to receive any feedback from columns that I write for the Culburra Bugle or the Callala Bay Newsletters.

Mr Anthony Grazzi, a frequent visitor to Culburra, phoned me and told me that firstly he enjoyed reading the local newsletters and secondly that he is a member of the Frangipani Society.

He asked if I would include a piece about the history of how plants came about from the First fleet in 1788 and namely the introduction of the Frangipani/ Plumeria in Australia.

“Australia’s first European settlers arrived in 1788, after long and hazardous sea journeys from England. The journey took about nine months, via either South Africa’s Cape of Good Hope or Rio de Janeiro in South America .

Suitable plants were progressively introduced but the settlers longed for ornament plants that were familiar to them. As most settlers came from England, Frangipani was not yet a plant that they knew, but it is recorded that when the first primrose arrived, it caused a stampede at the wharf.

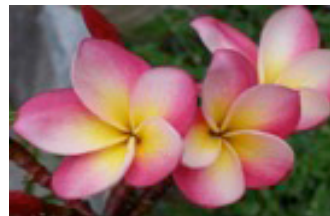
Arriving in 1826, Australia’s first nurseryman/ landscape designer; Tomas Shepherd, encouraged by the Governor, set out to produce plants commercially from the Government gardens. *(These gardens had been established in 1816 & became the Sydney Botanic Gardens.)*

Shepherd prepared a series of seven lectures on landscape gardening and presented the first lecture in 1835 but unfortunately died before he could deliver the series. His prepared text however, survives.

In this he extols the glories of the gardens established by Alexander Macleay, the Colonial Secretary at Elizabeth Bay House on the shores of Sydney Harbour.

The garden’s reputation spread far and wide but barely a fragment remains of its many magnificent acres. However, we do have records of the plants purchased, and they include Frangipanis. In his own handwriting Macleay prepared a “List of plants received at Elizabeth Bay-1836-1843... Received in May 1839 from Dr Nathaniel Wallich, Superintendent of the Calcutta Botanic Gardens, was *Plumeria acuminata* (an earlier name for *Plumeria rubra*).In his notebook, Macleay also lists seeds received between 1836-53,including item 151 -*Plumeria hybrida* from England in August 1839.These are believed to be the earliest references to Frangipanis in Australia.”

The Frangipani is another reminder of the Christmas/summer season. Driving through Terara, there are some magnificent classic yellow Frangipani and I have also seen a pink beauty in Callala Bay. These plants are very easy to strike from a cutting. Cut a branch, remove most of the lower leaves and stand the cutting in the shade for about two weeks. Once dried, insert in a pot filled with coarse sand or potting mix and water sparingly until roots form. Then plant in well drained soil and water only once or twice a week.

Does God hear our prayers?

It's an age-old question for many Christians.
When I pray does God even hear me?

I think too often those who wonder if God hears prayers are really saying "I prayed and asked and I haven't heard, so since I asked and have no answer then He must not answer prayers.

For me, I read scripture daily, I battle with sin and guilt in my life like anyone else and the best way I can possibly deal with it, is prayer.
Some good questions to ask yourself are:

- Did I have time alone with God today?
- Did I fervently pray and ask for the forgiveness I know I need?
- Did I pray and worship and thank the LORD for all He gives me?
- Did I take to Him those things that bother me? That make me want to cry?
- Did I ask for guidance on how to deal with mean people or pray for people who hate me?
- Did I read His Word? I mean really read it, not just skim it?
- Did I read a devotional or a commentary of some kind to help spur my thinking?

I can only speak of my experience but I know when I am doing these things then my spiritual life is healthier. I didn't say perfect. I didn't say I do it every day. I said WHEN I do it, then I'm spiritually healthier.

Christians know the difference when we are experiencing these kinds of moments with God and when we aren't. We can tell a difference – a physical and peaceful difference when we are seeking God.

In verse 6 of Psalm 18 David says it pretty clearly what he was doing in relation to his prayer life: "In my distress I called upon the LORD; to my God I cried for help. From his temple he heard my voice, and my cry to him reached his ears" (NIV)

David is crying to God because of the enemies that surround him and he is in distress. Once again, there is nothing like a good crisis to get us to focus on Who can fix it.

David uses two action words: **called** and **cried**.

These words are kissing first cousins but when we think about it they are different. I call my children all the time. I make phone "calls". But how often do I make cries to them?

I can picture David in such distress that he just cries out to God asking, seeking, praying, hoping for help. I can picture it because I have done it. What happens to those prayers of calling and crying? David reminds us best when he says that God, in His temple in heaven, hears us and that our prayers go right into His ears. Our prayers aren't just stacked up in His in-box but go directly to His ears. David tells us in the next verses how God reacted to his prayers and cries he is sending and it's quite dramatic. What we don't know is how long David had been calling and crying out before the answer came how long Lord how long?

Does God hear prayers? Yes, there is no doubt in my mind. Does He answer them when I want and how I want? That's another question which gives me comfort to know my prayer life isn't a useless effort. My call-outs and my cries go directly to heaven and directly to His ears and He hears my voice and you know what?

Yours do too.

POLICE REPORT

On the Beat

Picture this. You go shopping and find a car park. You drive into the car park and get out of your car. You are only going to the shop for a minute so you leave the keys in the car and the door unlocked. You go to the shop for a couple of minutes and then return to the car. Imagine your surprise when it is not there. “How does this happen?” you ask.

I can tell you how it happens, it happens because

people do not think about the security of their vehicles.

This scenario has played out a number of times in the past couple of weeks. I have mentioned many times in the previous 150 or so of “On the Beat” episodes about the importance of vehicle security. It may be the case that the not “on the Beat” readers are the culprits. I call upon all on the beat readers (**yes all 7 of you**) to rise up and tell 10 friends about the importance of Vehicle security every day for a week. Ask your friends to tell 10 of their friends (***but not you because you already know about it because you told them***). Everyone in New South Wales would know about vehicle security in a matter of weeks.

The Road Rules 2014 states;

If the driver will be over 3 metres from the closest part of the vehicle and there is no-one left in the vehicle, the driver must:

- if the windows of the vehicle can be secured—secure the windows immediately before leaving the vehicle, and
- if the doors of the vehicle can be locked—lock the doors immediately after leaving the vehicle.

Maximum penalty: 20 penalty units. (*Penalty unit is \$110*)

Please look up Dr. Google and read section/ clause 213 of this Act for further information.

Well done to the beach buffs, stealing seem to have dwindled down there at the moment. Stay vigilant and leave unnecessary items at home.

WILDLIFE RESCUE SOUTH COAST INC

WHERE HAVE ALL THE LITTLE BIRDS GONE

Have you wondered where all the little birds have gone?

An estimated 75 million native animals are killed or injured every day in Australia (*Australian Wildlife Conservancy research*) by feral cats. Yes every day. Other problems facing our wildlife are domestic cats, cars, dogs, foxes, introduced birds including Indian Mynas and humans. Habitat loss is also a major contributing factor.

What can we do?

There are a number of things, but here are two simple ones to start.

1. Become a responsible cat owner
2. Create a habitat in our garden for native animals and birds.

Responsible cat owners

Many Australian native animals and birds cannot defend themselves or their young against the introduced cat. Domestic cats are natural born hunters and some are extremely persistent.

They will attack small ground dwelling birds such as the beautiful blue wren once common in the area but now rare. Cats that are left out at night hunt small night animals such as feathertail gliders, sugar gliders, pygmy possums, ringtail possums, baby brushtail possums, bandicoots and microbats.

The Animal Welfare League and RSPCA recommend de sexing cats at eight weeks for their best recovery to avoid breeding unwanted kittens. All cats and kittens including those sold or given away must be micro chipped by 12 weeks of age.

It is our suggestion that you collar and tag your cat with your phone number.

All cats must be lifetime registered by six months

at one of Shoalhaven Council's Administrative offices. The registration is a one off payment and lasts the lifetime of the cat.

The Council Ranger is the central point of contact if you have lost your cat or you have found a cat. Dumping kittens is a criminal offence under the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act. Unwanted animals should be surrendered to the Shoalhaven Animal shelter for rehousing.

A cat is considered a stray if it is entering wildlife corridors or food preparation areas, or restricted properties. It is considered a nuisance cat if it interferes with the peace or comfort of neighbours, or damages property outside the domestic premises in which it is housed. If a cat is deemed a nuisance by an authorised Council officer the owner will be issued with a nuisance order.

The Companion Animals Act of 1998 provides a legal identity for cats and can issue nuisance notices with significant fines.

Create a habitat in your garden

This needn't be a major undertaking. Start small and make changes as you feel comfortable. Consider planting native plants into your existing garden.

The key points are:

- Local native plants – try the council, local Landcare, a good nursery. Native plants are also water efficient
- Different plants – make sure there is a variety of heights, thickness of foliage, flowering, seed and berry producing – include grasses and groundcover. Spiky plants are good for shelter and protection.
- A couple of good dense, 1-2m tall shrubs provide shelter for nesting and protection from predators.

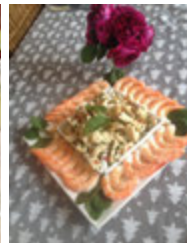
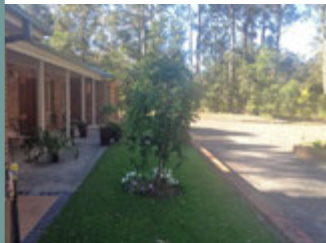

- Water – a birdbath, off the ground close to dense shrubs – where a cat can't reach it.
- Nests – leave leaf litter, twigs and softer materials etc so they can build their nests in your newly established dense foliage shrubs

Proper Email Address Etiquette

1. Respecting Privacy
2. To: CC: and BCC: Putting it into Practice
3. Creating and Maintaining Group Lists

To, Cc and Bcc: What's the Difference?

Most people know what happens when they address mail TO: people when creating a new message.

However, they are less sure about the two other options: CC: (carbon copy) and BCC: (blind carbon copy).

Use To: For Private Messages

If you are sending the message to only one address then the TO: option should be used.

Use BCC: for Lists

If you are sending the message to multiple addresses then the BCC: option should be used so that each person sees only their own address.

Use CC: Only in Special Cases

The CC: option essentially works the same way as the TO: option. Everybody will see the addresses included there. The main difference is intent.

In most cases you'll use the CC: option when you want to keep someone in the loop but no action is required AND all parties know the address.

Putting it into Practice

Use BCC: to Hide Address Lists

Blind Carbon Copy (BCC:) will hide the address list from all the recipients.

- Only the person's own address will appear.
- Some email programs place the phrase "undisclosed recipients" in the address field instead.

If your email program insists on at least one TO: address, enter your own. This will also let you see the sent message as your recipients do.

Use General Group Descriptions Instead

You may wish to indicate the general nature of the address list at the beginning of your message so that recipients have an idea of who the other recipients are (if necessary).

Using a generic phrase such as "forwarded to the production team" lets people know who has received the message without revealing names or address information.

Use CC: to Inform

Carbon Copy will reveal the address(es) listed but is used in place of the To: to indicate that the message is sent to those persons for information purposes only. It is not used when the other recipients may not know the address.

Individual Privacy in a Group Message

In a much more likely scenario where a large group is blind carbon copied you can appreciate the result — a message free of a long list of addresses and the preservation of individual privacy.

Creating and Maintaining Group Lists

When sending message to large groups of people on a frequent basis it is useful to set up a "group" address to save you the effort of selecting all the recipients each time you send a message to the group.

Create a Group List

Your email program will have the ability to do this using a "Group" function in the address book.

- Create a group for each category you need.
- Add or copy all the appropriate addresses into each group as appropriate.
- An address may appear in more than one group.
- A group may contain anywhere from one to dozens of addresses.

BCC: the Group

Use the Blind Carbon Copy (BCC:) addressing option to select the group address when you want to send a message to the whole group.

Everyone will receive the message listed with that group address, yet no addresses will appear on each message except that of the sender and possibly each recipient only in their own message.

Avoid Unscrupulous List Owners

Keep in mind that unscrupulous list owners (spammers) also include a remove option in their messages.

- Most such requests are ignored (the best you can hope for).
- The rest are used to confirm your email address so they can sell it to other spammers (the worst scenario for your privacy).

Business Communications

Using email for business is critical these days and you want to do it right. Avoid sarcasm or witty remarks. It is easier to offend someone via email than in person because the tone of voice and facial expressions aren't available as clues.

If you use Outlook or Outlook Express (*an obsolete program*) or compose your email messages with MS Word, you'll need to know that you may create an attachment called winmail.dat that is invisible to you, but creates problems for viewers using other email programs.

Avoid Long Lists of Addresses

Few things are as irritating as receiving a message only to find that your email address is listed along with email addresses for people you don't know. Not only is this poor etiquette, but it also invites misuse by any of the recipients or anyone they might forward the message to.

Privacy of Email Addresses

When people provide you with their email address — either directly or by sending you a message — there is the implicit expectation that you will not reveal it to others without their permission.

What's the big deal?

Just as you wouldn't appreciate your place of employment giving out personal contact information, many people feel the same way about their email address.

In fact, [privacy](#) has become a serious issue on the Internet and this concern will continue to grow

as people realize the commercial value of their private information and as they fight a losing battle against [spam](#) (unsolicited and unwanted commercial or non-commercial email).

Don't Get Labelled as a Spammer

Spam is an issue of consent, not content. Be sure the person you're sending to has a reason to expect your messages or they're likely to treat your message as spam.

Some jurisdictions have [severe penalties](#) for senders of unsolicited mail. You should also be sure that each person will find your mail appropriate, and not a waste of their time.

Spam is Out of Control

The volume of spam has become so large compared to legitimate mail that it threatens the future of email. I'm sure that you dislike spending an additional 80 percent on your Internet bill to pay for spam!

Originates in Newark, NJ, in 1978, when Shiva Ayyadurai, a 14-year old, dark-skinned, lower-caste, Indian immigrant boy, working at the University of Medicine and Dentistry New Jersey wrote over 50,000 lines of code to invent the world's first full-scale electronic emulation of the interoffice, inter-organizational mail system .

Consisting of: Inbox, Outbox, Folders, the Memo, Attachments, etc., naming the program "email," defining email as we all experience today, for which he received the first Copyright for "Email," in 1982, from the United States government - officially recognizing him as the inventor of email.

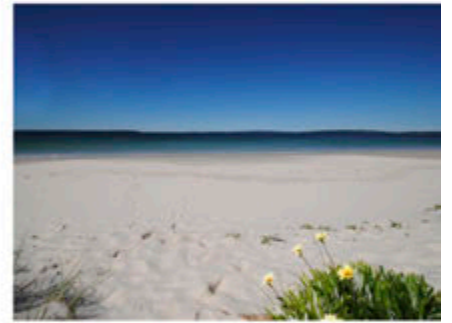
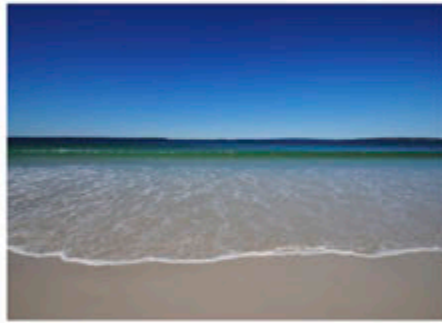
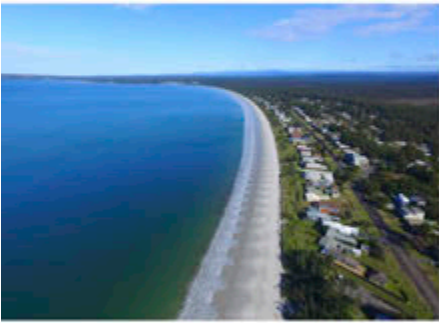
