CBCA Update

Well it's that time of the year again, it's hard not to think and write in clichés, however from all of us in the CBCA can we wish you and yours a merry Christmas and a happy new year.

Our Events Sub Committee have done a magnificent job in producing this years Callala Carols. It's been a high learning curve trying to get everything planned and co-ordinated. Well done, we hope everybody will enjoy the entertainment and sing along with loud voices.

We would like to recognise Zoe and Simon Okely for their generous donation to assist with the replacement of the Doggie Bag dispenser at Wowli Creek and purchase of the doggie bags. Thanks to the donation we have been able to purchase a second dispenser, which has been installed at the Callala Sporting Complex.

Our project to purchase and install new and replacement park benches and new picnic tables is progressing. SCC have approved the furniture and we should take delivery in mid- February. It is proposed to install them at various places along the path from Watts St to the end of the path at Marine Parade. We are currently going through the process of completing a variation to the existing AHIP (Aboriginal Heritage Impact Permit) to allow us to extend the current path from where it ends at Marine Parade to the small park at Callala Point.

We will also, subject to acceptance of the variation, install two more carved logs and a carved bench seat and have commissioned Noel Wellington to create the carvings. Funding for these projects has come from the Grant we obtained from the Community Building Partnership Program, a NSW State Govt program, to complete the path from Watts St to Sheaffe St, however Council undertook this construction. The CBCA was then faced with two choices, either refund the grant or seek to vary it. As part of our forward planning we had wanted to install more benches and picnic tables at some time in the future and would have applied for another grant. The CPB insisted that the grant money had to expended on path enhancement only and for no other purpose. Fortunately, with the assistance of our local State Member, our proposal was accepted.

There has been some chatter on Face Book about installing an outdoor gym, funding and the role of the CBCA. In 2017 Council suggested to the CBCA that they were prepared install an outdoor exercise facility. Currently they are still negotiating with the State Govt. to secure funds. Location of the facility is still to be determined, but both Council and CBCA believe it should be located adjacent to the path. As this is a Council initiated project and funded by them, the CBCA will play an advisory role in keeping the community informed.

Finally, our next general meeting will be February 13th, 2019. The AGM has been deferred to the March meeting 13/03/2019. If you wish to nominate for the committee, you must be a current financial member. Nominations can be emailed to admin@callalabaycommunityassociation.com

Our next major event after the carols will be the Australia Day Breakfast- we are still looking for nominations for the Callala Citizen of the Year.

South Coast Vet Report

New Year's Eve celebrations involve fireworks. Unfortunately, many animals are terrified by firework displays posing risks to animal safety by causing them to take flight and try to escape the loud noises. Dogs and horses in particular may be afraid of fireworks and many try to run away, sometimes injuring themselves in the process. Dogs can end up several kilometres from home.

Dogs have been known to jump through plate glass windows to escape loud noises, and easily jump over, or dig their way under fences that would normally contain them.

What can I do for my dog?

Prepare early.

• Talk to your vet about medical treatment options available for managing noise phobias - ask them about any new treatment options.

• Take your dog out for exercise before the fireworks start e.g. reasonably long walk, then after a couple of hours you can feed a meal. A tired and well-fed dog will likely be less anxious during the night. If you can, stay home to be with your pet.

• Let your dog be with you and try to be calm and normal. Avoid fussing over your pet excessively but try to engage them in normal activities such as playing. Reward your dog for their calm behaviour, rewards include giving dog treats and their favourite dog toy.

• Close the blinds/curtains, create a comfortable hiding place, use the crate if you dog is crate trained and allow your dog to go there to feel safe, put on some music to mask the noise of the fireworks.

• Dogs who panic can choke themselves on a collar or lead, so never tether your dog during these times and never use a choke chain to restrain your dog.

• Make sure your dog is microchipped and that your contact details are up to date on the microchip register. Also ensure they are wearing an ID tag so they can be easily returned if they accidentally escape.

• Direct supervision is important to help prevent injury or escape. If you cannot supervise your dog on the night consider making alternative arrangements so your dog will be supervised by a responsible person directly or consider boarding your dog so they will be safe.

Epiphany and the Wise Men.

6th of January was designated to remember the Wise Men delivering their gifts to the

Christ-child, it became the day we exchanged gifts within our immediate family. Before long it was one of our favorite celebrations. The boys had plenty of gifts to open on Christmas day from relatives and friends. The gifts we then shared with one another became very, very special. As we presented each gift we said" I give you this gift because the Wise Men brought gifts to baby Jesus and because I love you. The first year I though the boys were going to choke on the words when it came to tell their brother they love him. We as a family knew we each loved each other but it wasn't something they would say ever say.

Songs of love and good tidings while church bells rang

I saw His eyes twinkle as He moved out of sight "Please remember this visit, sleep well now, Good-night".

Well, it's all over for another year, before you know it, we will be celebrating Easter and Queen's Birthday Weekend. How time flies!

If your New Year's resolutions include a little bit of "me time", perhaps you might like to consider taking some of our classes. Acrylics, oil, pastels, watercolour, pen and ink, you name it we can offer it. We also offer polymer clay classes, living art classes and needle artistry.

Originally The Studio was going to be for 3 months. However, on Sunday 16 December 2018, we celebrated our first birthday. Not a bad result. We have learned a lot over this time and decided to hold a General Meeting to inform members of our actions, goals and direction. From the 20 or so members attending the celebration, many wonderful and exciting ideas have surfaced.

We will look into holding children's classes: shell/stone mosaics, clay modelling and sculpture, as well as scrap booking and card making.

The members also suggested we link with other groups and talk to people in the local community colleges, and possibly offer class work through NDIS. Perhaps we could do day trips to various galleries and painting excursions if it's possible to hire the Callala RSL Club bus. The members also thought it would be a great idea to have professional artists do demonstrations. Some thought it would be great to offer classes in creating sculptures made from recycled materials.

All this should be done with strong advertising promotions, using Facebook, flyers, sandwich boards to let more people know what we are about. The meeting then turned to the subject of volunteers. A full day is from 10am to 3pm and a half day could be 10am to 12:30pm or 12:30pm to 3:00pm. The Studio is open Wednesday to Saturday and 10:00am to 12:00 noon on Sunday. During school holidays, The Studio will be open on Mondays and Tuesdays. Everyone of the members present at the meeting has committed to joining the roster to help cover our opening hours. Thanks, guys.

We then discussed the Callala Winter Arts Festival, deciding it would a shame not to continue with this wonderful tradition, and a sub-committee will be formed to develop further ideas put forward at the meeting. By utilising the Callala RSL bus, we may be able to run people from one venue to another. It was suggested we offer spaces for pop-up markets as long as we are not in conflict with the Community Centre Markets. Members also suggested we start tracking sponsorship and contact such groups as the Rose Society, Berry, the Orchid Society and vitners from the local vineyards with a view to participating. It was felt the Callala RSL Auditorium would be a wonderful venue for the living art displays. We should also look to having a local Men's Shed help us with creating a number of easels for display purposes. The sub-committee will meet early in January 2019 to get this event rolling and hold regular monthly meetings.

In order to adhere with Government rules and regulations, it may be necessary for The Studio to commence as a co-operative art group, allowing more flexibility in bringing in talented tutors and taking students off-site to paint or attend Exhibition openings with other art groups.

Our thanks to the members and community who have supported us over this past twelve months. May we now begin a wonderful journey together for the next twelve months and we hope it is a terrific New Year. profitableholidayhomes





Is Jervis Bay Toxic??

"Toxic firefighting chemicals have been discovered in the once pristine waters of Jervis Bay, only weeks before hoards of Sydney holidaymakers are set to flood the popular tourist destination.

Warning signs have been erected at several waterways around the area. Marys Creek, of the greatest concern, has been totally closed to human use. People have also been warned to avoid seafood from Flat Rock Creek - neighbouring iconic Hyams Beach - Captain's Lagoon and Summercloud Creek. The pollution has stemmed from the historic use of fire retardants at two military bases: HMAS Creswell, at the northern tip of Jervis Bay Village, and the Jervis Bay Range Facility, to the south.

The foams contained per- and poly-fluoroalkyl chemicals [PFAS] which do not break down in the environment. Australia's Department of Health has denied the chemicals cause health effects in humans. However the United States has taken a different stance, warning the weight of evidence indicates PFAS causes adverse health outcomes, including immune, hormonal and developmental effects and potentially cancer.

This week Defence released its investigation into the extent of the PFAS pollution across Jervis Bay and the Booderee National Park. Testing indicated that, in the north, the toxins were leaching through Flat Rock Creek and Captain's Lagoon, draining into Jervis Bay. To the south, the chemicals were being carried by Marys Creek and Summercloud Creek into Wreck Bay, an area home to an Aboriginal settlement. The contamination was also being spread by the sewer network, with treated wastewater - still containing PFAS - being used to irrigate a local golf course. Traces of contaminants were also found in Lake Windermere, but concentrations were about 40 times below safe guidelines. Brisbane-based environmental medicine expert

Response from Shoalhaven City Council

You may have seen some discussion in the media

bout PFAS and the Defence base in Jervis Bay Territory. There have been conflicting messages, and mis-reporting so we wanted to inform you of some facts.

• The waters of Jervis Bay are some of the cleanest in the world.

• Tests showed that PFAS levels for the Jervis Bay Territory's drinking water did not exceed drinking water guidelines. Therefore there is no risk to residents and visitors from drinking the town water supply.

• The recently completed Department of Defence detailed site investigation did not find any significant PFAS contamination at any of Jervis Bay and Booderee National Park's visitation areas.

• There is no precautionary signage at Green Patch or Hyams, as incorrectly reported in the media. Levels of PHAS don't register as detectable in these areas.

• Precautionary signs have been placed in locations at Wreck Bay and on Defense land, outside of Jervis Bay Booderee National Park, where PFAS has been detected above guidance values.

• PFAS affects those who regularly ingest it over a long period of time. Specific instructions for fishing will be released soon via the Environmental Protection Agency.

It was incorrectly stated that Jervis Bay's drinking water comes from Lake Windermere. This is not true for the greater Jervis Bay area, all tap and drinking water at Booderee meets acceptable standards.

- It was incorrectly reported that signs have been erected at Green Patch Beach and Hyams Beach. All signage and warnings are within Wreck Bay and Defence lands.






