Valentine's Day

When I was growing up, Valentines Day was significant in our family. In fact, it was my father's favorite celebration. Dad proposed to my mother with a diamond ring on February 14th and of course she said Yes. Every year after he brought her a big box of chocolates. The loved they celebrated on the anniversary of their engagement was very special.

"O my love is like a red red rose", wrote Robert Burns two hundred years ago. It seems modern lovers agree. Florist shops will deliver more flowers than any season of the year. Hearts flowers cupids with their arrows chocolate cards and romantic verses are some of the pictures that come to mind when Valentines Day is remembered.

But have you ever wondered how all this relates to the Christian martyred Saint Valentine?

The true origin of Valentine's Day is not easy to discover. Research turns up a variety of stories that have influenced the way we celebrate the day. The present traditions are a mixture coming from all of the stories that a true remembrance of the martyred Saint Valentine.

Like so many of our cultural celebrations, this February date can be traced back to a Roman festival of romance. It was a fertility festival or lover's holiday looking forward to the return of spring. In the 5th century in an attempt to abolish the pagan festival, Pope Gelasius changed the pagan date of celebration to 14th February and called it Saint Valentines Day, and even though the name and date changed the emphasis of the celebration continued to be on "lovers".

Valentine was a young priest who was beheaded on this date because he refused to renounce his faith in Christ. The legend tells how just before being led out to his execution, the young Christian wrote a note to his jailer's blind daughter signing it, "From you Valentine". The very first Valentine was from a Christian.

Over time the word Saint has been dropped from the title of the day, removing society's memory of the Christian reason for the days celebration. Instead of the negative reaction of the pagan origins of the day, let us reclaim and celebrate the meaning of true love that compelled young Valentine to give his life . What a wonderful opportunity to lead our young children into a better understanding of God's love , which enables us to love one anther.

The ultimate description of love is found un John 3:16 "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal Life".



Garden Club Roundup

As bush fires hovered close in the south coast, it was an anxious time for many of us. Who can forget New Year's Eve- at 4pm it was already dark, smoky and the sun was a fire ball blazing in the sky? I had mixed feelings wishing family and friends a Happy New Year after watching the destruction left by fires on the media. We salute the fire fighters and volunteers for their effort and endurance, and we are so grateful that our local districts were spared. On a happier note, I spent Christmas in Hobart and while I was there temperatures were mild and there were no threats of bushfires. Everyone in Hobart was awaiting the yachts in the Sydney to Hobart race. Just a few minutes from Hobart are the Royal Botanical Gardens. These gardens are the second oldest after Sydney which were established 2 years prior. The gardens are beautiful and as I walked around each section, I took note of other types of drought resistant plants growing happily with cacti and succulents. As much as I love cottage garden plants, I must rethink my garden when summer ends. It makes sense to plant drought resistant ones which are hardy and can tolerate heat and wind conditions.

Here are some of the following which stood out at the garden -

*Kniphofia Poco Orange-this is an evergreen dwarf poker which clumps to form striking yellow or orange flowers in summer .It is drought tolerant once established and prefers a full sun to part shade position



*Arthropodium Cirratum (Renga lily)- another hardy, evergreen, clumping perennial with broad

lush green foliage with sprays of delicate, white flowers in summer. It prefers a filtered sun to part shade position: ideal under trees and is drought tolerant.



*Teucrium marum, the cat thyme- this is the first plant I noticed when entering the main gate- this species is not really a thyme. It has small, oval leaves giving it a thyme-like appearance. This cat thyme is a perennial with grey-green leaves tipped by fragrant pink flowers in summer.



* Yucca-flamentosa -Golden sword- Yucca flaccida 'Golden Sword' is an easy-to-grow, yucca. It has bright, yellow foliage with a dark green edge and bell-shaped, creamy-white flowers in late summer.

Bushfire Season

We would like to take this opportunity to thank all our extremely brave volunteer RFS workers. They have tirelessly worked around the clock for months to protect lives and properties.

This fire season has been particularly devastating, 30 people have lost their lives, our heartfelt sympathies are with those affected.

We have lost more than 10 million hectares of bush, forest and park. But the biggest loses have been to our beautiful wildlife an estimated 800 million animals have lost their lives, including 30% of NSW koalas.

Australians and people around the world have donated very generously to various charities to help people recover but the same amount of money hasn't been flowing to our wildlife organisations.

Please dig keep and consider donating or volunteering to our wildlife organisations, our beautiful animals keep your help. Australian wildlife is unique in the world and most species only call Australia home, it is our responsibility to protect and care for them.

South Coast Vets

The recent unprecedented and wide spread fires have had a severe impact on wildlife, including threatened species. Many animals have been killed or injured. Those that have survived are left without their usual habitat, they have little or no food, water or shelter, resulting in starvation and dehydration. They are also at increased risk from from feral predators like foxes.

Injured and sick animals are being rescued and cared for by licensed rehabilitation organisations

and individuals. It is important to get help from these trained carers if you come across animals in need. Injured animals can be dangerous to handle. Handling injured animals may cause them further stress if not done correctly. Entering fire-affected areas can be very dangerous.

If you find a sick or injured native animal in the Shoalhaven, please contact Wildlife Rescue South Coast 0418427214. Members are trained specifically to care for sick, injured and orphaned Australian Native Wildlife. If you would like to make a donation the money is used to acquire medication, bandages, specialist wildlife food, supply expert veterinary care and to repair or replace cages, aviaries and other equipment lost in the fires.

NSW National Parks with the NSW Government is designing and implementing an emergency recovery plan to protect and restore wildlife populations. They are conducting a rapid assessment to identify habitat that has been lost to threatened species and taking action to provide supplementary food, shelter and water to threatened species. For example; targeted food drops for brush-tailed rock wallabies and watering points for koalas.

National Parks is also increasing feral animal control with fox baiting, trapping and other control measures to protect threatened species. Weed control is being implemented to protect habitats.

February already; during the past few months we have experienced so much disruption with fires and ongoing drought. With Autumn only a month away how will the tragedies of the past months affect the way we see the year ahead? Will, as some suggest our future direction will be determined by these recent events? Will the ongoing debate on causes just lead to finding someone to blame, creating further division within our nation? Or, will the generosity so plainly seen, take our focus off ourselves and towards those in need? These are important questions, my hope is that we will move from the blame game and start getting together, finding solutions that see the problems from a wider perspective.

During these recent fires one word that we heard used repeatedly was; "the Apocalypse". We may have seen films depicting the end of the world, scenes of terror and destruction. Or, maybe we have heard or read of this term in sermons or Christian literature. But what does it really mean? The Greek verb apokalypto simply means to uncover, disclose or reveal. Rather than revealing doom or end of the world stuff, it has revealed the generosity and the resilience of many within our community. And, hopefully a better way of being Australian. We have also revealed the bravery and self-sacrifice of our emergency services; perhaps it also revealed some inadequacies of our fire prevention strategies and which equipment was the most effective. I'm sure in the wash up we will have lots of debate; we can only hope this will not be politically driven and a broader debate might reveal the truth. Not my intention to comment any more although I wait with interest for the final analysis.

As we consider what apokalypto means; I wonder if we might consider the following statement; If Jesus is the revealing of God in human form, and I believe he is; then what does he have to say to us as we navigate through the coming year? Jesus tells us not to worry. Worry accomplishes

nothing, God calls us into action. Jesus reminds us that by worry we cannot add even an hour to our life. Not only can worry not achieve anything, what it can do is rob us of our peace, and at times our ability to think clearly.

Jesus also reveals that God loves all people, even those who fail to acknowledge him; "This is how much God loved the world: He gave his Son, his one and only Son. And this is why: so that no one need be destroyed; by believing in him, anyone can have a whole and lasting life. God didn't go to all the trouble of sending his Son merely to point an accusing finger, telling the world how bad it was. He came to help, to put the world right again".
