The History of Callala Public School Part 1

Progress meeting a letter was written by Denise Mulligan, and many other residents to the Department of Education enquiring as to when the 'proposed' school would be built. The response from the Department listed the school as "listed as future nomination on a forward cap works program". Correspondence continued to flow between the Council, Department, Progress Association and Mr Ellis (MP) Member for South Coast.

In 1995, a committee was formed under the umbrella of the Callala Bay Progress Association. Chairperson being Denise Mulligan, with secretaries Teresa Bealey and Jacquie Ney. At the time there were between 250 and 260 children being bussed from Callala Bay to attended school at Culburra.

Culburra Public School was built to educate 400 children and had to have a number of demountable classrooms installed to accommodate the children being bussed over from Callala. This increase in student numbers put a lot of stress on the resources at the school, especially the sewerage system which often had difficulty keeping operational.

As the children continued to be bussed over to Culburra (a 22 kilometres round trip sitting 3 to a seat), our dream of a school for Callala slipped down the priority list. The Callala School Committee continued to write letters, hold meetings in all the villages and started to raise money to resource our new school when it was eventually built.

In 1997 we were still getting the run around from the Department, we couldn't seem to have the school move up on the capital works list.

Meanwhile at Culburra Public School the Department of Education provided yet another demountable classroom making 22 classrooms, 14 were demountable.

The demountable classrooms were not only very hot, but took play area away from the children.

The School Committee which now had 10 dedicated committee members,; we arranged press releases, did radio interviews, and continued to write to all politicians. We adopted purple as our colour and regularly did letter box drops advising the community of when and where the next meeting would be, our progress and how they could help.

In 1998 we continued to write and hold meetings

We attended a council meeting and secured their assistance in holding a public meeting. We had the support of the June Baker, Pat Mason and Pam Arnold, as well as Joanna Gash. We were advised that 20 - 30 communities who pushed for a school each year - only 10 were successful.

We were advised to have a mission statement and as a result of the public meeting which was attended by 180-200 residents - our mission statement was:-

"We want a school by the year 2000".

ANGLICAN CHURCH

April 16th is Easter day, a day when the Christian Church celebrate the Passion Death and Resurrection of Jesus Christ.

We all know about death; resurrection is when Jesus rose from death after three days but what is passion, or if using in context, of the Passion of Jesus?

The Oxford dictionary describes passion as "any powerful or compelling emotion or feeling, such as <u>love</u> or hate"

We may have a passion for chocolate, or a certain type of food, But Christ's Passion was his love. His love for his Father, his love to do his Fathers will, his love of all people and his love to bring people into fellowship understanding and faith in God. Christ' Passion was so strong that it led his to the Cross. Human beings were made for relationships, God made Eve to be a companion of Adam because he was lonely, all the other creatures had a mate.

So from the very beginning humans have needed a relationship whether in the form of a friend, a soul mate, a partner, a spouse. Each one of us have a relationship with others. But sadly sometime we make mistakes. When we form a relationship, we grow fond of the person, we like them very much, we can even begin to depend on them, sometimes that leads to a feeling of passion or love for them.

Love is such a strong emotion that we assume it will last forever with little or no attentions but like all things that we want to last; nurturing is an important factor if we are to love. There are many different types of love – love of parent for a child, child for parent, husband wife. Love is one of the greatest things that we can ever experience, but it is also one of the most misunderstood.

Many things we call love are actually just selfinterest, masquerading under another name. However, withholding love has no place in the hearts of Christian people.

Let us not judge others because they don't fit in with our own life styles, personalities, or religious beliefs. Just think of all our own faults and the fact that Jesus still loves us passionately in spite of them.

The famous benchmark passage about love for Christian is 1 Corinthians 13:4-8: Love is patient, love is kind, love is not envious or boastful, or arrogant or rude. Love does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; love does not rejoice in wrong doings, but rejoices in the truth. Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things endures all things. Love never ends.

Perhaps reading it, we feel that we fall woefully short of those godly standards. In many ways perhaps we do; love is not natural for us, and this is why we find if so difficult. It is far easier to just look after number one – our self without having to consider others, but God has called us for something higher.

Commitment. God has called us to commit our self to love one another as we love ourselves. If you love someone, you don't opt out when the going gets tough – we persevere; we keep going, you find a way through. That is love - laying down your own rights, putting them aside and sticking with the other person no matter what. And that was Jesus' Passion for us when He went to the Cross on that first Good Friday.

May you have a very happy and Blessed Easter.

POLICE REPORT ON THE BEAT

CRIME STOPPERS 1800 333 000

Over the past couple of months the men and women of the Shoalhaven Local Area Command have been out and about looking for illegal drugs.

We have been targeting the cultivation and supply of cannabis in the area and have been pretty successful. In the previous two months cannabis plants with an estimated street value of \$352,000 have been seized and destroyed.

Last Friday the officers from the Target Action Group based at Nowra went out and seized \$165,000 worth of Cannabis Plants.

Police cannot do this alone. We rely on information from the public. If you are out and about and you see any suspicious activity or behaviour, maybe a dodgy car in the bush while you are bush walking etc, - tell us. If you do not want to give your name, call Crime stoppers on **1800 333 000**, you can give your information anonymously.

We are all part of the community so let's all make our community a safer place to be, especially for our kids. Let's get more drugs out of the community.

The Highway Patrol were also out the other day targeting 'hoon' drivers as well as doing random drug and alcohol testing. Remember if you drink and drive, or drive under the influence of an illicit drug, you will get caught and you will be dealt with. That's it for this week.

Also on Sunday, the No 7 pennants team traveled to Ulladulla for their washed out round. Callala was defeated 47 - 63, but still managed to score 2 points for the round. Our thoughts go out to several of the players who are unwell at the moment and were unable to play this weekend. Better luck next week boys.

The men's pennant teams, played their games on Saturday 18 March, managing to complete the round despite several stoppages due to passing heavy rain, and thus avoiding having to play a wet catch up game. Callala Grade 7 team hosted St Georges Basin 1 in a very tight round. Even though Callala won 2 rinks and the end count, St Georges Basin won the overall by one shot, 60 - 59. The point score for the round was St Georges Basin 8 to Callala 2.

The grade 5 team traveled to Nowra for their round 4 match. This game was also interrupted by rain which did not help. Callala had a disappointing day going down on all rinks plus the overall points. Better luck next week boys, against Culburra.

The Roof over the Fishing Table at the boat ramp has been ordered and will be erected shortly. Funding has been made possible by a grant from the Department. of Primary Industries and supplementary funding from our Community Projects reserve.

The Headland Indigenous Pole project is on track and plans are now being developed for a hand over ceremony

James Morris and Howard Duncan will be meeting with Councillor Patricia White to discuss funding and grant applications for three new projects

A viewing platform at Callala Headland overlooking "Lefties" reef and stairs to enable access to the rock platform and reef. The platform will enhance visitor's opportunities for spectacular views of the Bay and the stairs will provide safer access for exploring the rock platform and access to the reef.

Currently the informal "path' down the cliff face is dangerous and if the issue is not attended to there is a danger of erosion from run off which could lead to instability of the path causing rock fall and injury. Development of a better boat ramp. - Maintenance of the nature strips especially Chisholm St and Lackersteen St approach to Bicentennial Reserve.
- Issues associated with the remediation adjacent to the Sailing Club.

CALLALA MEDICAL NEWS

We have had a really hot summer with lots of sunny days, and with that, I have been seeing quite a few patients with skin cancers. The Royal College of General Practitioners recommends patients who have had lots of sun exposure or have had skin cancers in the past to self check for skin cancers every 3 months, and for a clinical check by your doctor every 6 months.

For self examinations, patients should look out for any changes in their skin, especially new lesions, that may be painful, bleeding or ulcer, or may fail to heal after the usual expected time frame.

With melanomas, the ABCD guideline for spotting a skin cancer is as below:

- (A) Asymmetry as in if a line was drawn in the middle, it should look same both sides.
- (B) A changing border
- (C) A change in colour especially blue, grey, red or black.
- (D) A lesion that has an increase in diameter

If anyone has any concern with any skin lesions, or is at high risk for skin cancers, it is best you discuss your concerns with your team

GARDEN CLUB

The AGM was held at the March meeting and it was chaired by Zone Coordinator and President of Ulladulla Garden Club, Lindy Bonser.

Our 2017 committee is in place and all will be striving to increase membership and continue to make our club a strong social outlet for the community. Valerie Tranter, also from Ulladulla Garden Club, was guest speaker.

She spoke on the Garden Club of Australia 2017 Biennial Convention which they are hosting in November. It's theme of Destination Shoalhaven Sun, Surf and Scent-sations, is designed to showcase small town gardens, large outlying properties and visits to local nurseries.

The theme for Display table was Green foliage for St Patrick's Day and members brought in a large collection from the delicate maidenhair fern to the large showy strelitzia leaves.

On show was also the" old fashioned" Aspidistra.



The Aspidistra elatior, native to Taiwan and Japan is commonly known as the "cast-iron plant" or "iron plant".It is called the cast-iron

plant because it survives almost any conditions and does well in a shady spot in the garden.

Most people will know Aspidistra elatior because in the Victorian era, you would inevitably see one of these plants in a brass pot usually in the parlour.

This plant clumps up and when you get a clump, they're usually pretty easy to divide .

It also has a flower which is small and just above the soil line but the plant is mainly grown for its foliage. The only maintenance it requires is to cut away the dead leaves and fertilize during it's active growth. Florists use the leaves in arrangements, as the leaves provide an excellent background for flowers.

As with most old fashioned plants, the Aspidistra may one day gain popularity again and be seen in fancy new pots in every home.

In the last issue, I mentioned our "garden guru" Jack King and his Tacca plant. I was so looking forward to sharing the news that his plant has finally flowered but sadly for us he passed away on the 6th March at the age of 95 years. Jack was a gentleman, very bright, kind and generous. He was one of the founding members of the club and will never be forgotten. We will miss him very much.

On *Easter Saturday, April 15th*, Culburra Senior Citizens will be holding their annual fete in Waratah Hall from 8am – 1pm and we will be having a plant stall. We'd love you to come and check out our stall for a bargain.



VET'S ADVICE

ver the last few weeks there have been several news stories about the release of a new strain of rabbit calicivirus, so I thought this might be a good time to talk about pet rabbits.

Rabbit calicivirus was released to help control the population of wild rabbits in Australia.

A vaccine is available and the Australian Veterinary Association recommends all pet rabbits should be vaccinated as follows:

- Kittens 4, 8 and 12 weeks old, then every 6 months
- Adults 2 vaccinations given 1 month apart, then every 6 months

Other ways to help protect your pet rabbits include preventing contact between pet and wild rabbits. This includes not letting pet rabbits graze in your back yard if there is a risk it has been contaminated by wild rabbits. Good insect control is also important.

Hutches can be insect proofed with fly screen, or rabbits can be kept inside. Insect control is also essential for protecting rabbits from myxomatosis. Fipronil (*Frontline and Frontera*) is highly toxic to rabbits and should never be applied for insect control.

Pet rabbit ownership has increased over the last few years. There are a variety of breeds, sizes, coat types and colours now available. What ever the breed, there are few basic aspects to rabbit care that are common to all.

Feeding is one of the most important factors in keeping a healthy rabbit. Rabbits evolved to eat grass and should be provided with plenty of fresh grass or hay. Timothy, Ryegrass or pasture hay are suitable, but avoid lucerne and clover hay.

Fresh leafy green vegetables such as broccoli, cabbage, spinach or dark lettuce leaves should be offered daily. Fruits and root vegetables (*such as carrots*) can be offered in small amounts as treats. Pellets and mixes are very convenient, but unfortunately many do not meet the nutritional requirements of a healthy rabbit and should only be fed as treats. Fresh water should always be available.

Rabbits need to chew to maintain healthy teeth. Hay and grass encourage correct chewing. Remember, they will chew anything, including their wooden hutch and bedding material. If rabbits are kept inside they may also chew furniture and even electrical cords.

Most rabbits enjoy being handled. They should be picked up supporting the front and back legs, and never around the belly or by the ears. It is important to start handling rabbits from a young age so they become accustomed to being held.

This is especially important if there are children involved. Rabbits can kick very strongly with their hind legs, which can scratch the handler as well as injuring the rabbit.

Rabbits should be allowed to exercise freely for part of the day. This may be inside, or outside in a secure yard.

Playtime is important - wooden toys to chew, boxes to hide in and destroy or hidden food treats are all excellent play ideas.

There are many things to consider before adopting a rabbit, but with the correct care and attention, they can make excellent family pets.



HOME FIRE SAFETY

We are approaching the end of the Fire Danger Period (*March 31*st) here in the Shoalhaven, it is a good time to remind everyone;

fires don't just occur in the bush. House fires can happen too. Here are some simple steps you can follow to reduce your risk of a fire in your home:

- MOST IMPORTANTLY... have an adequate number of suitable smoke alarms installed throughout your home. Test them regularly & change the battery at least every 12 months. TIP: Change your batteries when you change the clocks for daylight saving time!
- Make sure you and all your family know two safe ways out of every room in your home.
- Have a written home escape plan in case of fire and practice it regularly.
- Never ever leave cooking unattended.
- If you have a fireplace make sure to put a screen on the front and the chimney is clean.
- Check electric blankets for damage before placing on the bed.
- Take care to keep curtains, tablecloths and bedding away from portable heaters.
- Keep wet clothing at least 1 metre from heaters or fireplaces. Never leave unattended.
- If you use a clothes dryer make sure you clean the lint filter every time you use it.
- Only use one appliance per power point and switch off at the power point when not in use.
- Store matches/lighters in a secure place away from young children.
