CBCA REPORT for June

It is interesting how the worm turns and you discover you are responsible for putting 'pen to paper' to advise you readers of the happenings in Callala Bay. In the absence of Howard and Margaret Duncan, who are by now sunning themselves on the banks of the River Seine in France, I will give it my best shot.(says James Morris)

The Community General Meeting held on Wednesday, 10 May 2017, provided the usual array of excitement and news for the Bay and I am happy to report:

- The inscribed totem poles should be installed into the three headland positions as this Newsletter goes to print. Have a look at them and I am sure you will be impressed with the work that displays some of the indigenous history of our town. These will also be a continuation of the walkways that have been used by peoples from all nations over the past millennia and beyond.
- The shelter for the fishing table at the Callala Bay boat ramp has finally arrived at Nowra after a gestation period of some 18 months or so and our thanks are directed to the Department of Primary Industry, specifically the Recreation Fishing Trusts for the Grant to allow this to occur. The trick is now to install the shelter; so, don't be surprised if there is a call for volunteers to assist.
- Many of you will be aware of the success of the first version of the Trades Directory developed and distributed by the Callala Bay Community Association. A second version has been compiled and printed and distributed to the Village shops. This means over 1,000 copies of the Directory has been distributed throughout the Bay and you are invited to advise the editor of its success.

Have you used any of the trades or businesses? Please let us know, as there will not be a reprint until early 2018, unless there is a strong desire from the contributors to do so.

Current Roadwork Activity: Various drainage projects will be undertaken around Bay St, Chapman St and Morton St area. For further information please contact the Northern District Office on 4429 3821.

The proposed changes to the intersection of Sealark, Derwent and Sydney Streets, was discussed with the appropriate Council representative on 11 May 2017. Council has agreed to widen the shoulders on the sweeping right hand bend from Sealark to Sydney Streets, and will closely monitor driver behaviour to ensure the changes are consistent with the road safety requirements.

They have advised if these changes have not achieved the required result, additional work will be recommended.

Future Roadwork Activity

Callala Beach Rd and Forest Road Intersection - Road widening and safety improvements.

Works include the removal of selected trees on the northern side of the intersection, the construction of a passing lane for East bound traffic and the placement of a 10 mm AC surface over the intersection.

Callala Beach Rd—Road pavement reconstruction and road widening will commence in mid to late June 2017. The works will be undertaken from Emmett St for 500 m to the north.

How the locals like it.

GARDEN CLUB

re you enjoying this glorious autumn weather? As I walk around Callala, liquid ambers and tibouchinas are at their best.

The weather has cooled down considerably and it's more comfortable to work in the garden.

One of the perks of being secretary is that I receive newsletters from other garden clubs.

Horticulturist Hazel King from the Berry & District garden club shared the following tips for your garden during the month of May-

- 1. Fertilise lawns to promote root growth
- 2. Late winter/spring flowering bulbs should be planted especially cold climate bulbs, such as tulips, hyacinths and true crocus
- 3. Plant vegetable and flower seeds and seedlings
- 4. Grevilleas, banksias, salvias, plectranthus are now in flower and are attractive to birds.
- 5. There's new small hybrid tibouchinas, purple flowered Groovy Baby, pink and white flowered Cool Baby and white with pink stamens Peace Baby.

Something magical is happening to my Chinese happy plant (*Dracaena fragrans Massangeana*), which is growing in a small garden under my pergola. Sprays of small numerous white flowers have come out of the crown and they have a highly fragrant sweet scent.



The flowers seem to open at night and a sticky substance is coming out of the

flowers. I wasn't aware of this happening until a few weeks ago. The same has happened to my friend at Worrigee - her happy plant which is growing in her front garden, is flowering as well. We think it's due to the extreme warm weather that we have been experiencing this summer/ autumn.

Dracaena fragrans Massangeana are good indoor or shaded plants that are extremely hardy and require little care.

This particular variety is native throughout tropical Africa and is the most popular due to its dramatic yellow variegation running down the centre of its leaves. They like good drainage that allows them to dry out between watering.

However keeping *Dracaena fragrans* too dry will result in brown leaf tips.

Duringgrowing, fertilizewith slow release fertilizer or use a liquid fertilizer in half strength every month. A flowering happy plant is said to be a lucky omen - I'll let you know if anything happens!

POLICE REPORT

On the Beat.

Truancy - an act or instance of playing truant; the state of being truant.

Were your kids at school this week or were they in a state of being truant? Who gets in trouble when your son or daughter doesn't go to school?

Have a guess! It's not rocket science people. If your child or children do not attend school, it is you, the Parent who may have to go to Court and explain to the Magistrate why your child doesn't need to be educated.

I am not talking about missing the odd day or being out without a permission slip. It's in relation to prolonged absences by your child or children from the School.

The Education Act 1990, section 22 states;

It is the duty of the parent of a child of compulsory school-age to cause the child:

- to be enrolled at, and to attend a government school or a registered nongovernment school, or
- to be registered for home schooling under Part 7 and to receive instruction in accordance with the conditions to which the registration is subject.

This means the kids have to go to school and if they do not go to school they have to be registered for home schooling If you fail to send your child to school you may be fined at Court;

- in the case of a first offence 25 penalty units, or
- in the case of a second or subsequent offence—50 penalty units, or
- in the case of a parent subject to a compulsory schooling order—100 penalty units

For your information, one penalty unit is \$110, you do the maths.

No honestly, you do the maths, I can't count that high I don't have enough fingers. Anyhow it's a lot of money.....

Please, if you are aware that your child or children are wagging school, do something about it. Have a talk with your child to see if there are any issues. You can contact the School.

If you are still having problems you could contact your local PCYC or organize an appointment with the Police School Liaison Officer.

Just don't do nothing. If your child is out and about during School hours without a permission slip the Police or the Department of Education may well become involved.

What is the Fire and Emergency Services Levy?

From 1 July 2017, the NSW Government is introducing a fairer system for funding our community's fire and emergency services. At present, these services are funded by a levy on insurance, which will be removed from 1 July 2017. From this time, all properties, not just insured properties, will directly contribute to the cost of these services through the Fire and Emergency Services Levy (FESL).

The FESL will be paid alongside your Council rates. You will be notified in July this year, of your FESL contribution as part of your Council rates notice, or a separate notice for non-rateable properties.

ROADWORKS UPDATE

Greenwell Point Road, Greenwell Point - Works will involve rehabilitation of 600m of road pavement and construction of adjacent shoulders. The work zone will be either side of the Mayfield Road intersection. Works are expected to be completed by early July, subject to good weather and no other delays being encountered. Traffic control will be in place throughout the works and will change as the project progresses. The road is expected to remain open, however, only one lane will be operating and there will be limited access to Mayfield Road.

T trust we all have been enjoying the beautiful autumn weather after all the rain.

Now, as winter approaches we see smoke from chimneys and days becoming shorter; less time spent mowing the lawn and perhaps contemplating finding a comfortable chair and a good book.

Each season brings with it changes, lessening of daylight hours, moving from summer heat to the briskness of winter; the cold days of winter give way to the freshness and lifegiving spring; the one thing that remains constant is that as long as we can remember the season cycle has continued faithfully, bringing both seedtime and harvest.



Budget 2017 delivers Gilmore a healthy improvement

Budget 2017 has delivered on the Federal Government's commitment to guarantee Medicare and build the world's best health system.

VET'S ADVICE

DENTAL DISEASE

Did you know that dental disease is one of the leading disease concerns in dogs and cats. Over 80% of dogs and 70% of cats that are older than 3 years will have some form of dental disease.

Take a look at your pets teeth and gums. Are the teeth white or do they have brown stains or deposits. Does your pet have loose teeth? Are the gums pink, or are they red and receding? What about your pet's breath. Is it tolerable, or does it make you want to leave the room?

Dental disease also causes pain. Owners will often tell us that their animal is not in pain it is still eating. Unfortunately this is not true. Imagine if you had a loose diseased tooth - would it cause you pain? Of course it would! If your gums were inflamed - would your mouth feel comfortable. Of course not, and your pet is no different. They continue to eat otherwise they would starve, it is a matter of survival, but that does not mean they are not painful.

From the moment teeth erupt through the gums they are exposed to saliva, food and bacteria. These components stick on the teeth to make plaque. If the plaque is not regularly cleaned away, it can mineralise (from the components in saliva) and become hard. It is then called calculus. This calculus is the thick brown deposit that can be seen on unhealthy teeth. Sometimes the calculus will also turn grey. Calculus is a fantastic breeding ground for bacteria.

Plaque and calculus can irritate the gum where it joins the tooth and cause gingivitis. The inflamed gums will often bleed, and gum tissue may be destroyed. The bacteria in the plaque can also start to destroy the ligament that holds the tooth in its socket, plus the bone surrounding the tooth.

The bacteria can also enter the blood stream and cause generalised illness in your pet.

If bacteria destroy the ligaments it is called periodontitis. The damage caused by periodontitis is irreversible and action needs to be taken before the condition worsens further.


Fortunately, dental disease can be treated and in many cases, prevented. If calculus is present, your pet needs a professional scale and polish under general anaesthetic. Antibiotics may be needed. Loose teeth will need to be removed. In older pets, blood tests prior to the anaesthetic and intravenous fluids before, during and after the anaesthetic may be recommended.

A dental check will be performed by your vet at the annual routine health check. Some animals require dental checks more frequently. Your vet will advise what is best for your pet.

If your pet does not have calculus, then home care measures may be all that is needed to improve dental heath and prevent issues. The sooner home care is started the better. Starting when your pet is a pup or kitten is ideal.

Next month I will discuss preventative measures you can undertake at home to keep those pearly whites healthy.

June is Bowel Cancer Awareness Month, and we encourage people to come forward and discuss your risk of bowel cancer and how to screen for it.

Bowel cancer in Australia is the third most common form of cancer, and the second biggest cancer killer. Often, bowel cancer does not have any symptoms - but common symptoms of bowel cancer may include:

- Bowel habit changes
- Changes in the appearance of bowel motions
- Blood in stool
- Bloating and cramping
- Feeling of incomplete emptying
- Unexplained fatigue
- Abdominal or rectal pain

It is advised to commence bowel cancer screening at the age of 50, or earlier if you have a family history of bowel cancer (ten years before the age of their diagnosis).

It is best to come and discuss with your friendly team at the *Callala Medical Centre* about your risk of bowel cancer and the best way to screen for this.



Failure to do so results in us turning up and extinguishing the fire and can lead to fines. Please be mindful of any older residents, young children or neighbours with respiratory conditions.
